
- Developer initiated easement/property acquisition, design and construction for McKinnon & Windermere Road Flooding

Total Private Commitments to Community

- ~ \$4,500,000 + Million Dollars
- Offsite Drainage Improvements: McKinnon Road,
 Windermere Road Flooding Relief: \$434,000
- Walker Pond Road Acquisition + Improvements: \$4.2M
- Offsite Utility Improvements: \$96,000

WHY APPROVE THE PROPOSED PSP

- Provides a mechanism to address the McKinnon Road and Walker Pond Road flooding issue via new stormwater outfall drainage design and stormwater piping installation project
- Approximately \$2,000,000 of right-of-way acquisition for Walker Pond Road
- Reconstruction of Walker Pond Road that brings underground power, creation of a sidewalk that doesn't exist, off-site utilities that bring ability for existing residents to use potable water, and switch from Septic to Sewer.
- Additional residents to contribute to the MSTU for Lake Roberts for long term funding
- The request is Consistent and Compatible with the surrounding developments.
