


Background and Purpose

- Apopka CRA (Community Redevelopment Agency) is scheduled to sunset on January 1, 2024
- City of Apopka is requesting to extend the CRA for three years, and eventually seven more years to continue their redevelopment efforts
- The County reviews and approves requests for most CRAs to reauthorize for additional terms

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Background about CRAs

- Local governments designate a redevelopment area based on a finding of necessity and establish a CRA to implement a redevelopment plan
 - -Authorized by § 163, Fla. Stat.
 - -Foster redevelopment of targeted areas (§ 163.340, Fla. Stat.)
- Redevelopment plan identifies projects to revitalize the area
 - Substandard building structures, shortage of affordable housing, inadequate, infrastructure/parking, and insufficient roadways
- Source of funding is tax increment financing (TIF)
- Public investment spurs private sector investment



Background about CRAs

Requirements

- —A charter county is granted exclusive authority to create CRA districts within their jurisdiction (§ 163.410, Fla. Stat.)
- A charter county may delegate such authority to municipalities within its boundaries via an inter-local agreement

Governance


- -CRA Governing Board- BCC or City Council + County Representative
- Advisory Committee
 - Makes Recommendations to governing board



Background about CRAs

- Orange County CRAs- 2
 - –BCC is the Board of Directors
 - -Orange County (Orange Blossom Trail) CRA and International Drive CRA
- Municipal CRAs- 7
 - Board of Directors is the city council or the city council plus one or two additional appointed members, one of which is appointed by the Board
 - Oversee 13 areas
 - Apopka, Eatonville, Maitland, Ocoee, Orlando,Winter Park, and Winter Garden







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- In 1993, the Apopka CRA was created and the CRA Redevelopment Plan adopted to revitalize the area in and around the City's downtown
 - -Initial term of the plan was for 30 years, ending January 1, 2024
- In 2017, the Updated Redevelopment Plan was adopted
 - -Did not extend CRA sunset date



- CRA Board- 7 members
 - -Mayor Nelson and 4 City Commissioners
 - Orange County appointee
 - -City appointee
- City Staff
 - Works with CRA Board to implement the plan and manage the tax increment funding
 - -CRA funds are not used for administrative or personnel costs





Financials

- Apopka CRA is funded by tax increment financing (TIF)
 - Captures the growth of the ad valorem tax revenues in the CRA

- –Rebate provision- County payment greater than...
 - \$1 million, 30% of excess rebated to County
 - \$2 million, 50% of excess rebated to County


TIF Projections

- -FY 2024-2026 (3 years)
 - Based on the 2017 redevelopment plan (prepared by S&ME)
 - City contribution- \$736,770
 - County contribution- \$862,645

- -FY 2024-2026 (3 years)
 - Based on Orange County OMB's analysis
 - 10% growth per year
 - City contribution- \$1,181,923
 - County contribution- \$1,919,899



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CRA and Redevelopment Plan Extension

- Apopka is requesting to extend the CRA and redevelopment plan for three years, and eventually seven years, to continue redeveloping the downtown area
- Upcoming Projects
 - Downtown Apopka Trail
 - Parks- skate park/BMX track,City Hall Park, and 8th Streetneighborhood park
 - Wayfinding signage
 - -Streetscapes







CRA and Redevelopment Plan Extension

- Staff supports extending the CRA for three years, with the option to extend for an additional seven years based, in part, on the following conditions:
 - County is recognized, alongside the City, for capital improvement projects and major accomplishments using TIF revenue
 - Apopka provides annual updates to the County
 - -City expends 50% or more of TIF revenues generated each year
 - —At the end of the three years, the City expends 50% of all TIF revenue, including roll over



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Resolutions and Inter-local Agreement

- Apopka CRA and City Council Resolution
 - -Extends CRA and Redevelopment Plan to January 1, 2027
 - Adopted December 6, 2023
- Orange County Resolution
 - -BCC consents to extend the CRA and Redevelopment Plan to 2027
 - -Extending the CRA from 2027 to 2034 is based on the following conditions
 - County is recognized, alongside the City, for capital improvement projects and major accomplishments using TIF revenue
 - Apopka provides annual updates to the County
 - City expends 50% or more of TIF revenues generated each year
 - After the three years, the City expends 50% of all TIF revenue, including roll over




Resolutions and Inter-local Agreement

Inter-local Agreement

- First amendment to inter-local redevelopment agreement
- Approved by Apopka and the CRA on December 6, 2023
- County agrees to extend the CRA Plan for three years, with the option to extend for an additional seven years subject, <u>in part</u>, to the following
 - County is recognized, alongside the City, for capital improvement projects and major accomplishments using TIF revenue
 - Apopka provides annual updates to the County
 - City expends 50% or more of TIF revenues generated each year
 - After the three years, the City expends 50% of all TIF revenue, including roll over



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Requested Action

Approval and execution of Resolution of the Orange County Board of County Commissioners regarding the City of Apopka Community Redevelopment Agency; Consenting to Amendment of the Community Redevelopment Plan to extend the CRA's sunset date to January 1, 2027, with the Potential to extend to January 1, 2034;

Approving the First Amendment to Inter-local Redevelopment Agreement among Orange County, City of Apopka, and the Apopka Community Redevelopment Agency. District 2.
