# Overview

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Vision: Orange County Head Start: School-Ready Children and Self-Reliant Families.

• Mission: Orange County Head Start provides high-quality comprehensive services to low-income children and their diverse families through collaborative partnerships.

- Full day / Full year program
- 1,536 Funded Enrollment
- 23 Center Based Sites
- 85 Classrooms

## Importance of Early Childhood Education

- Critical Brain Development: Early childhood is a period of rapid brain development, with 90% of brain growth occurring by age six.
- Foundation for Future Learning: Early childhood education lays the groundwork for future academic success, helping children develop essential skills such as critical thinking, problem-solving, and social interaction.
- <u>Economic Benefits</u>: Investing in early childhood education yields significant economic returns. Children who receive quality early education are more likely to succeed in school, graduate, and contribute positively to society.



#### **Orange County Government Economic Investment**

- Orange County Head Start is one of fewer than five programs in Florida that has maintained its enrollment capacity without reducing slots for children.
- Orange County Head Start employees have received cost-of-living adjustments ranging from 3.5% to 9%, significantly surpassing the federal rate of just 2.35%, demonstrating Orange County's commitment to their financial well-being and support.
- Despite federal restrictions on using grant funds, Orange County Head Start employees benefit from longevity pay and additional incentives such as sign on bonuses, and referral pay paid with county dollars.







**Kindergarten Readiness & Beyond**

- This alignment ensures that Head Start programs in Florida effectively plan lessons that prepare students for kindergarten.






# School Readiness 4 Years Olds

- Awarded the Florida Head Start Association 2024 Sargent Shriver award for the collaborative partnership with VyStar Credit Union.



- Creation of financial literacy materials.





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


# **Challenges**

- Additional Funding for Inclusion Services
- Third person in classrooms with high number of special needs





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 Seek Quality Improvement funding opportunities through the Office of Head Start to enhance program effectiveness and outcomes.

Explore and apply for 1303 federal construction funding to support facility upgrades and infrastructure improvements.

 Broaden collaboration with community organizations to enhance and increase direct services available to families, thereby improving support and resources.



 Obtain financial resources to bolster inclusion support in classrooms, ensuring a diverse and supportive learning environment for all students.

 Collaborate with Orange County Public Schools and the Early Learning Coalition of Orange County to develop a comprehensive workforce initiative.

Ensure compliance with the Office of Head Start's Final Rule by adhering to the specified guidelines and requirements.
