Prevention Work with youth ages 13 – 25 in zip codes where the incidence of violent crime is highest Intervention Promote interagency cooperation & coordination among service providers





Prosecution Enhance prosecution of gun violence and violent crimes



# **Community Crime Survey – Key Findings**

Community Crime Survey – 2,508 Responses | 47 Zip Codes
70% - rated their feeling of safety as safe or very safe

- 49% stated the level of gun violence and violent crime in the past three years has increased
- 54% of the respondents rated the level of police protection as excellent or good
- 30% felt law enforcement makes it easy to provide input to them to help solve problems



- 54% did not feel they had access to prevention and intervention programs
- 64% expand mentoring and intervention programs for youth and young adults



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# Task Force Report | Prevention Subcommittee

**Recommendation #2:** Expand/Enhance Access to Effective Youth, and Parenting, Mental and Behavioral Health Programs

#### **Short-Term Actions:**

- Credible Messenger review the impact of the program and determine if additional funding is needed
- Partner with municipalities to implement evidence-based Community Violence Intervention (CVI) models





 Disseminate information to the community, school district, and stakeholders regarding Orange County funded programs and services

## Task Force Report | Intervention Subcommittee

Recommendation #1: Develop a detailed plan that addresses generations of neglect and poverty by formulating a 3-year vision with a systemic focus that reviews the structural changes that provide a healthy community where everyone thrives.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

• Enhance the family support system to include prenatal care, childcare, and early childhood education



**Recommendation #4:** Define, develop, and fund a credible messenger's program.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

 Utilize a program that will respond during a violent crisis to assist the individual and community

# Task Force Report | Intervention Subcommittee

**Recommendation #5:** Coordinate with mental health providers to increase the number of providers in the areas identified and require the agencies to increase their hours of operation.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

• Enhance life skills including peace and conflict resolutions skills

**Recommendation #7:** Create a realistic channel for communication with the community and youth

**Proposed Long-Term Actions:** 

• Utilize billboards for enhanced communication- DELETE

• Work with the youth to create and implement a social media communication channel for peers- DELETE





# Task Force Report | Enforcement Subcommittee

Proposed Recommendation #1: Establish and maintain a Community Ambassador (CA) Program that will be tasked with connecting community organizations, community leaders and community members as well as attend community events on behalf of the county providing details on key resources, activities and events to assist in initiatives that directly or indirectly impact crime in the community.

#### **Proposed Short-term Actions:**

- Connect law enforcement agencies & community stakeholders regarding ongoing community events
- Provide information on county programs & services



## Task Force Report | Enforcement Subcommittee

Proposed Recommendation #2: Use county media platforms to partner and assist law enforcement agencies in publicizing and increasing awareness of their agencies use of evidence-based practices and non-traditional approaches of community policing and engagement initiatives designed to further build public trust in communities historically distrustful of law enforcement and disproportionately impacted by gun/violent crimes.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

 Connect with law enforcement agencies and share information on County's media platforms

**Proposed Recommendation#3:** Implement public safety workshops with law enforcement agencies and community stakeholders through an independent third-party facilitator. - **Delete** 

Proposed Recommendation #4: Assist Orange County Sheriff's Office Behavioral Response Unit and Orlando Police Department's Community Response Teams, which provide a joint response to calls that involve people in mental health crisis, to increase awareness of their programs and services by using available county media platforms while also providing statistical updates on program activities.

**Proposed Short-Term Action:** 

 Community Ambassador share mental health initiatives through various platforms







## Task Force Report | Prosecution Subcommittee

**Recommendation #1:** Implement Geographic Stewards Program in the Community

**Proposed Short-Term Action:** Lack of funding and limited staffing has inhibited the progression of this recommendation

#### **Recommendation #2:** Implement Civil Citation Diversion Programs

\* Due to the recent announcement by the State Attorney's Office on August 10, 2023, the newly appointed State Attorney has suspended all diversion programs except for pretrial diversion through state or county probation.

## Task Force Report | Prosecution Subcommittee

Proposed Recommendation #3: Identify a Legislative Advocate who will make recommendations for legislation that will create protections for witnesses and neighboring persons to facilitate their willingness to share information.

Proposed Recommendation #4: State Attorney's Office to issue a statement of affirmation and commitment to prosecuting gun violence cases to the fullest extent possible.

**Proposed Recommendation #5: Increase street cameras universally and not just in target areas.** 



# Task Force Report | Prosecution Subcommittee

**Proposed Recommendation 6:** Recommend the following questions be added to future Community Crime Surveys:

- 1. If you have perpetrated a crime of gun violence, what would have prevented you from committing that crime?
- 2. Have you had communication with prosecuting authorities in the past year? If so, were you a victim or a witness?
- 3. Do you know how the prosecution system works? (Or similar question to assess familiarity with prosecution processes).

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
