Background

History of the Ocoee JPA


- Original JPA Agreement was approved on February 11, 1994
- Amended the agreement eighteen times in order to facilitate planning and development initiatives
- -The City of Ocoee terminated the JPA Agreement on February 10, 2019, and began working with Orange County Staff on a new JPA agreement
- —The City of Ocoee approved the new agreement on November 5, 2019

Key Provisions

 The JPA as proposed provides for an expansion of lands (+/- 582 acres) incorporated into the Joint Planning Area Boundary Map (Exhibit A)




JPA Boundary Map

JPA Boundary Map




Key Provisions

JPA Future Land Use Map




Key Provisions

- Protection of the Clarcona and Gotha Rural Settlements
- Mutual desire to improve Ocoee Apopka Road including, but not limited to, Complete Street Design and the widening of Ocoee Apopka Road
- Continued efforts to improve and oversee redevelopment activities in the City's Community Redevelopment Area
- Agreement term is for five (5) years, with automatic five
 (5) year extensions
