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- EPD received questions about operation & composition of the EPC from D1
- Staff reviewed historical EPC actions, evaluated member roles and advisory board composition
- EPD and OCAO presented staff findings to EPC and MMRB (2024)
- EPC and MMRB recommendations were compiled and presented to BCC on July 9, 2024 (Worksession)
- BCC directed staff to propose ordinance updates
- First public hearing conducted October 30, 2024 (EPC)
- Second public hearing January 28, 2025 (BCC)



- EPC current composition and representative membership role:
  - -Professional Engineer
  - -Agricultural Interests
  - -Recognized Environmental Conservation Organization
  - **—Two Representatives of Private Businesses or Municipalities**
  - -Environmental Specialist
  - -Citizen Representative (aka At-Large Representative)



## Summary of the Duties and Powers of the EPC:

- Evaluate new rule proposals and existing rule revisions, make recommendations to BCC
- Review staff recommendations for appropriate fees to be charged by the county for the services
- Hold public hearings on appeals of staff decisions regarding environmental permits, make recommendations to BCC
- Make recommendations to the BCC regarding improvements to the natural resources and environmental issues



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# Proposed Ordinance Amendment

### Sec. 15-30 - Same–Organization.

(a) The Orange County Environmental Protection Commission established pursuant to this act [article] shall consist of seven (7) members appointed by the board of county commissioners and shall comply with chapter 2, article VI, creation, operation, review of advisory boards, of this Code.

# Proposed Ordinance Amendment

### Sec. 15-30 - Same–Organization.

(c) The composition and representative membership of the commission shall be as follows:

- (1) A representative who is a professional engineer registered licensed in the state, pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 471, Florida Statutes, as amended from time to time, with experience in the field of civil engineering or environment engineering; that is relevant to the duties and responsibilities of the commission
- (2) A representative of <u>the</u> agricultural <u>interests</u> <u>industry</u> actively engaged in agricultural operations, <u>such as</u>, <u>but not limited to</u>, <u>bona fide farming</u>, <u>pasture</u>, <u>grove</u>, <u>or</u> <u>forestry operations</u>, <u>including horticulture</u>, <u>floriculture</u>, <u>viticulture</u>, <u>dairy</u>, <u>livestock</u>, <u>poultry</u>, <u>bee</u>, <u>and aquaculture</u>;
- (3) A representative of <u>a</u> recognized environmental conservation organizations;

# Proposed Ordinance Amendment (continued)

### Sec. 15-30 - Same–Organization.

(c) The composition and representative membership of the commission shall be as follows:

- (4) Two (2) A representatives of a private businesses or municipalitiesy who are is directly regulated, affected and or subject to the provisions of this act [article];
- (5) A representative who is an environmental specialist with a degree in a scientific field and specific knowledge of aquatic biology, zoology, botany or other <u>similar</u> related field;
- (6) A <u>Two</u> citizen representatives of the interest and point of view of the general public for the effective and continuing protection of the environmental quality of the air, water, and land in the County and not directly regulated or affected by the provisions of this act [article].



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Ordinance update better defines member roles/selection criteria
Number of EPC members remain at seven
MMRB and EPC have been briefed on proposed updates
No public comments provided at first public hearing
Appointments & Reappointments for EPC representatives remain on hold pending BCC approval of the proposed Ordinance



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## Ordinance updates approved

- -Effective Date pursuant to general Law (typically within 10 days)
- -Membership and Mission Review Board (MMRB) proceed:
  - Fill vacant EPC member positions (Citizen Representative (2), Agricultural Interest)
  - Reappoint EPC members with expired terms (Regulated Business or Municipality, Environmental Specialist, Professional Engineer, Recognized Environmental Conservation Organization)
- -MMRB collaborate as needed with EPD during vetting process
