The Orange County Sheriff's Office is requesting \$5,000 from the FY 2022 Law Enforcement Trust Fund-State Forfeitures for the following purpose:

Contribution:

MADD, Central Florida Chapter – \$5,000. This contribution provides funding to help the Mothers Against Drunk Driving, Central Florida Chapter educate residents living in the area about the consequences of driving drunk, educate youth on the dangers and consequences of underage drinking, and offers comfort and support to drunk driving victims. They also provide death notification sensitivity training to law enforcement officers, coroners, and funeral home directors on how to deliver the news of drunk fatalities to family members.

ACTION REQUESTED: Approval for the Orange County Sheriff's Office to spend \$5,000 from the FY 2022 Law Enforcement Trust Fund-State Forfeitures for an eligible contribution to MADD, Central Florida Chapter.
