The Orange County Sheriff's Office is requesting \$16,000 from the FY 2020 Law Enforcement Trust Fund for the following purposes:

#### Contributions:

Children's Safety Village - \$5,000. This charitable organization is one of Orange County's essential resources for life-safety education for young children. Last year the staff served over 22,000 community residents with programs and services focused on drowning prevention, pedestrian and bike safety, gun safety, internet safety, and dangerous person awareness.

Concerns of Police Survivors - \$1,000. This organization works to meet the needs of families and co-workers of our honored ones that have fallen in the line of duty.

Orange County Police Athletic League (PAL) - \$10,000. This organization is a juvenile crime prevention program that provides athletic, recreational, and educational activities to at-risk children. PAL allows a law enforcement officer to spend time with these children in the role of coach, mentor, instructor, and role model, encouraging them to avoid crime, drugs, gangs, and violence.

ACTION REQUESTED: Approval for the Orange County Sheriff's Office to spend \$16,000 from the FY 2020 Law Enforcement Trust Fund to provide eligible contributions to the Children's Safety Village (\$5,000), Concerns of Police Survivors (\$1,000) and Orange County Police Athletic league (PAL) (\$10,000).
