- WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted by Chapter 84-490, Laws of Florida, and as amended by chapter 67-1830, the Board renamed the Orange County Air and Water Pollution
 Control Board as the Orange County Environmental Protection Commission; and
- WHEREAS, in 1996, the Board approved Ordinance No. 1996-37 to expand the composition and representative membership of the Environmental Protection Commission to
 seven members comprised of the current membership of a professional engineer, a representative of agricultural interests, a representative of recognized environmental conservation organizations,
 two representatives of private businesses or municipalities directly regulated, affected and subject to the Act, an environmental specialist with a degree in a scientific field, and a citizen representative; and
