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Continue and enhance the County's holistic response to the needs of homeless persons (and those at-risk of homelessness) by making substantial investments in outcome-driven and innovative programs, services, and projects while also attempting to reduce the County's risk of litigation and liability under the State's new public camping law (Section 125.0231, Florida Statutes)



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March 20, 2024 – Governor approved House Bill 1365

- -Effective October 1, 2024, created a new Section 125.0231, Florida Statutes, that prohibits the County from authorizing or otherwise allowing any person to regularly engage in public camping or sleeping
- Beginning January 1, 2025, authorized residents, business owners, and the Attorney General to bring civil actions against the County to enjoin violations
 - If a resident or business owner prevails, then a court can award reasonable expenses including court costs and attorney fees



June 18, 2024 – Board held work session on homelessness

- -Presented the regional context on homelessness and Orange County's funding of Programs and Services
 - \$45.6M in FY 23-24
 - \$46.5M allocated in FY 24-25
- -Discussed HB 1365 and a pending U.S. Supreme Court case that could impact the County's ability to respond to the new statute (*City of Grants Pass, Oregon v. Johnson*)



June 28, 2024 – U.S. Supreme Court published an opinion in City of Grants Pass

-Held that local government ordinances that prohibit sleeping or camping on public property do not violate the Eighth Amendment's Cruel and Unusual Punishments Clause





July 10, 2024 – Board FY24-25 work session held

 Homelessness update and discussion of proposed additional \$10M for homeless services

September 19, 2024 – Board held a second public hearing on FY 24-25 budget

- -BCC approved additional \$10M for homeless services
- -Total Orange County budget for homeless services increased to \$56.5M for FY 24-25



October 1, 2024 – County staff met with local municipalities and law enforcement agencies to discuss the response to HB 1365

-Most municipalities either already had in place, or were proposing public camping ordinances in response to the new law



Local Municipalities

Municipality	Camping Ordinance
City of Apopka	Section 42-151 prohibits public camping. Section 42-2 creates a trespass policy for public property.
City of Bay Lake	City staff has indicated that the City is developing an ordinance.
City of Belle Isle	Section 18-13 prohibits camping in parks.
City of Lake Buena Vista	City staff has indicated that the City is developing an ordinance.
City of Maitland	Section 11-4.6 prohibits sleeping in parks. Adopted Ordinance No. 1420 on August 14, 2023, creating a trespass policy for public property. Adopted Ordinance No. 1437 on December 9, 2024, prohibiting public camping and sleeping on public property.



Local Municipalities (continued)

Municipality	Camping Ordinance
City of Ocoee	Section 59-2 prohibits camping on all public property in the City.
City of Orlando	Section 43.52 of the Code prohibits camping on all public property.
Town of Windermere	Sections 18-14 and 18-15 prohibit camping.
City of Winter Garden	Section 118-11 prohibits camping on all public property in the City.
City of Winter Park	Adopted Ordinance Nos. 3321-24 and 3322-24 on October 17, 2024, creating a trespass policy for public property and prohibiting public camping and sleeping, respectively.



November 19, 2024 – Board held a work session on homelessness

-Reviewed existing County-funded homeless services

- Prevention/Diversion Services
- Rental Assistance
- Shelter/Drop-in Center Operations
- Supportive Services/Intervention
- Outreach
- Rapid Rehousing
- Capital Improvements/Renovations/Construction
- Information Management Systems (HMIS)





November 19, 2024 – Board held a work session on homelessness (continued)

- -Discussed the programs/services proposed for the *additional* \$10M in funding appropriated by the BCC for FY 24-25 including:
 - Expanding existing services
 - Increasing shelter capacity
 - Launching new initiatives

-90.5% of projects from the additional \$10M assist with housing

• Approximately 1,020 additional people housed



November 19, 2024 – Board held a work session on homelessness (continued)

- Orange County Funding for Homeless Services
 - FY 24-25 Total: **\$56,548,596.84**
- Compliance with new state law (HB 1365)





November 19, 2024 – Board held a work session on homelessness (continued)

- -Discussed HB 1365, the opinion in *City of Grants Pass*, and the County's options to attempt to cure alleged violations of the statute including:
 - Offering alternative lodging to people engaged in public camping
 - Using Florida's trespass statute
 - Adopting an ordinance that prohibits public camping



November 19, 2024 – Board held a work session on homelessness (continued)

- -Discussed other counties and local municipalities in Florida that have ordinances prohibiting public camping
- -Board directed staff to draft an ordinance that prohibits public camping



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Section 26-111, Orange County Code

- -Titled, "Public camping or sleeping, prohibition, notices, and penalties"
- -Purpose is to not authorize or otherwise allow any person to regularly engage in public camping or sleeping as prohibited by Section 125.0231, Florida Statutes
- -Effective in both incorporated and unincorporated areas within Orange County (except within those incorporated areas that maintain an ordinance covering the same subject matter)

Section 26-111, Orange County Code (continued)

- -Applies to public property under the jurisdiction of Orange County including, but not limited to, any public building or its grounds and any public right-of-way under the jurisdiction of Orange County
- -Defines "public camping or sleeping" in a manner substantially similar to Section 125.0231, Florida Statutes
 - Includes lodging or residing overnight in an outdoor space with or without a temporary shelter
 - Excludes lodging or residing overnight in a motor vehicle and excludes camping for recreational purposes

Section 26-111, Orange County Code (continued)

- Prohibits a person from regularly engaging in public camping or sleeping on any public property under the jurisdiction of Orange County
- -Authorizes a resident, business owner, and the Attorney General to provide written notice of an alleged violation to the BCC
 - Requires the County Administrator to designate an e-mail address or other electronic submission method to receive such written notices
 - Requires written notices to include certain information to enable Orange County to take reasonable action to cure alleged violations (including location, date, and description)

Section 26-111, Orange County Code (continued)

- **–**Enforced by law enforcement officers
- -Punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500, jail not to exceed 60 days, or both
- "WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Orange County Board of County Commissioners that compliance with this Ordinance be achieved through services, assistance, warnings, or other non-coercive measures and that criminal arrest be reserved as a last resort to assist Orange County in curing any alleged violations of the Act"



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- Approval and execution of an Ordinance Pertaining to Public Camping or Sleeping in Orange County, Florida; Amending Chapter 26 ("Miscellaneous Provisions and Offenses"), Article VI ("Offenses Involving Public Places"); Creating Section 26-111 ("Public Camping or Sleeping, Prohibition, Notices, and Penalties"); Providing the Purpose; Providing the Scope and Applicability; Providing a Definition of Public Camping or Sleeping; **Prohibiting Public Camping or Sleeping; Providing for Notices of Violations; Providing for Enforcement and Penalties; Providing for Repeal of Laws in Conflict; and Providing for Filing of Ordinance and Effective Date**
 - -Draft ordinance dated 12/19/2024
- Authorization for staff to correct any scrivener's errors in the draft ordinance

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
