Overview of Programs and Resources

Renter Resource Programs

- Crisis Assistance helps residents maintain housing, prevent eviction (1 month's rent and/or utilities)
- 2. Family Resource Program helps residents maintain housing, prevent eviction due to long-term medical issues or significant unanticipated issues
- 3. Eviction Prevention Program helps residents with minor children prevent eviction and maintain housing
- 4. Homeless Prevention Program assistance to households at risk of homelessness



Overview of Programs and Resources

Rental Assistance Programs (provide rent subsidies for very low-income households)

- 1. Section 8 and HUD-VASH (Federal funds) traditional vouchers and Veteran Affairs supportive housing for homeless veterans and their families
- 2. Tenant Based Rental Assistance (Federal funds) for seniors and persons with disabilities
- 3. Shelter Plus Care (Federal funds) housing and supportive services for homeless persons with disabilities



Overview of Programs and Resources

Affordable Rental Programs

- New construction of affordable rental projects
 (Federal, State & Local funds) implemented through public-private partnerships
- 2. Multi-family rehabilitation (Federal & State funds) rehabilitation of existing rental communities to ensure long-term affordability
