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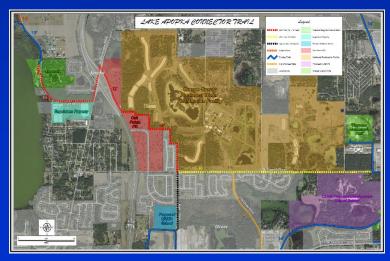


- Pine Hills Trail at Bus Transfer Station
 - -Construct trail portion on Lynx property
 - Lynx designing bus transfer station at Silver Star Rd. and Belco Dr.
 - -Estimated completion date 2021
 - -Total project cost = \$344,000



Proposed CIP Projects

- Lake Apopka Loop Connector Trail
 - -Design for trail to connect West Orange Trail to the North Lake Apopka Loop Trail
 - -Construction scheduled for FY 22/23
 - -Design funded through LAP Agreement
 - \$1,300,000
 - -County funding \$210,000
 - -Total design cost = \$1.5M





Proposed CIP Projects

- Harrod Property
 - -Acquisition of property located on the Little Econ River in East Orange County
 - -Closed on Property Sale May 28, 2020
 - -Limited passive park
 - **-\$1M** for development







- East Orange District Park Playground
 - -Design for new playground
 - -Cost = \$50,000
