The Orange County Sheriff's Office is requesting \$174,500 from the FY 2024 Law Enforcement Trust Fund-Federal Justice Forfeitures for the following purpose:

Equipment:

Rapid ID Scanners – \$174,500. Purchase of 100 Rapid ID Scanners to be used by the Uniform Patrol Division. These scanners will allow deputies in the field to identify citizens they encounter if they have fingerprints on record. The Rapid ID Scanners have been tested in the field and represent the most cost-efficient option to replace current identification devices.

ACTION REQUESTED: Approval and execution for the Orange County Sheriff's Office to spend \$174,500 from the FY 2024 Law Enforcement Trust Fund-Federal Justice Forfeitures for Rapid ID Scanners.
