




Tropical Cyclones 101





Realtime Flood Forecasting

- Predict flooding up to 72 hours
- Determine areas for evacuation orders
- Plan emergency response priorities during a major storm, including prioritization of staff resources

 - Distribute special needs sandbags through 311

OC Utilities Updates

- -Field Services Division
 - Staff emergency drill exercises May 22 & 23
 - Cross-training department staff
 - Prepping equipment for response
 - -113 mobile generators
 - -67 stationary generators
 - -13 backup pumps







OC Utilities Updates

- Water Division
 - Exercised fully manual (no automated control) operations procedures at all regional water plants
 - Completed annual maintenance and refueling of generators







OC Utilities Updates

- Engineering Division
 - Pump Station ManagementGIS Dashboards
 - Allow visualization of OCU pump stations, subarea locations, and emergency generator routes by pumping service areas
 - Indicators and charts are used to summarize the current operating mode of assets





OC Utilities Updates

- Hurricane Preparedness Reminders
 - Social media outreach on Facebook,
 Instagram, Twitter and Nextdoor
 - Trim trees and shrubs ahead of storm season and set out for curbside collection
 - Keep account information updated
