SUBJ: **Establishment of a Multi-Way Stop Condition at the Intersection of South Park Avenue and East 8th Street**

Based on the analysis of traffic data and safety concerns, the community has identified a need for increased safety measures at the intersection of South Park Avenue and East 8th Street. Over the past 12 months, there has been a notable number of correctable crashes at this intersection, highlighting the need for enhancements.

The installation of a multi-way stop control is proposed to address the safety issues and reduce the risk of accidents at this location. By implementing stop signs at each leg of the intersection, we aim to enhance visibility, regulate traffic flow, and mitigate potential conflicts between vehicles and pedestrians.

This initiative will be a joint effort between the City of Apopka and Orange County due to jurisdiction/maintenance responsibilities. The City will install American Disability Act compliant curb ramps /signage and Orange County will install Pavement markings.

Staff recommends that the Board approve the establishment of a multi-way stop condition at the South Park Avenue and East 8th Street intersection.

Action Requested: Approval of a multi-way stop installation at the intersection of South Park Avenue and East 8th Street. District 2.
