As discussed in the Utilities Department Budget Work Session presentation, staff is recommending an adjustment to the Orange County Solid Waste disposal rate, or tipping fees, at the Orange County Landfill and transfer stations. These rates have not been increased since October 2017.

The Solid Waste System has experienced significant cost increases in recent years. Operating expenses have increased annually at an average rate of 6.9% due to rising costs in personal services, maintenance of equipment, maintenance of open landfill cells, and capital outlay for landfill equipment. Additionally, the needed rehabilitation of the McLeod Road transfer station has placed a strain on system finances.

Looking forward, significant funds are needed beyond operating costs for the construction of Cells 11 and 12 for Class I waste, continued build-out of Cell 2 for Class III wastes, and transfer station improvements. All of these requirements cannot be satisfied with revenue from the current rates. Therefore, staff recommends implementing a 3.5% increase in tipping fees to take effect on October 1, 2020 to meet the upcoming financial requirements of the system.

Orange County Attorney's Office staff has reviewed the resolution and finds it acceptable as to form and content. The revised Solid Waste System Charge Schedule will be presented in the public hearing on September 1, 2020.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Orange County (the "Board") is authorized to establish, operate, and maintain a waste collection and disposal system within Orange County (the "System") pursuant to its powers as a charter county, Florida law, and Section 32-16, Orange County Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board is also authorized to prescribe, fix, establish and collect fees, rentals, or other charges for the facilities and services furnished by such waste collection and disposal system, or any part thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Board last adopted a revised fee schedule for solid waste disposal at County disposal facilities on August 1, 2017, pursuant to Resolution 2017-M-28; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds it necessary to revise the fee schedule in order to enable the System to better fund its cost requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Board authorized, scheduled, and publicized a notice of public hearing to consider the adoption of the revised fee schedule in accordance with Section 32-16, Orange County Code:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY:

Section 1. Revised Fee Schedule. The Board of County Commissioners

hereby adopts the revised fee schedule attached to and incorporated in this Resolution as Exhibit "A". The attached schedule supersedes and this Resolution hereby repeals the presently existing fee schedule as adopted on August 1, 2017. Resolution 2017-M-28 is superseded and repealed when this Resolution becomes effective.

Section 2. Severability of Provisions. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Resolution, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of the Resolution are declared severable.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect on October 1, 2020.

EXHIBIT "A"

SOLID WASTE SYSTEM CHARGE SCHEDULE¹

All vehicle types pay the prevailing fee for the applicable category for covered loads. Any mixed loads will be charged for the higher fee category.

Uncovered loads are charged at 2 times the rate for covered loads of the applicable fee category.

Class III and/or yard waste materials delivered to a transfer station will be charged the Class I Solid Waste rate.

Minimum charge for all vehicles is \$6.00.

<u>Fee Category</u>	<u>Fee Per Ton Effective October 1, 2020</u>
1. Class I Solid Waste (Putrescible garbage)	\$36.00
2. Class III Solid Waste (Construction and demolition debris)	\$27.40
4. Yard Waste	\$31.10
5. Dewatered Wastewater Treatment Sludge	Accepted by agreement only
6. Asbestos	\$118.00
7. Waste Tires	\$158.00

FOOTNOTE

¹For those customers under written contract, the contract shall prevail if, and to the extent, there is any inconsistency between the provisions of the charge schedule and the provisions of the contract.
