

FIRST AMENDMENT
to
Art in the Chambers Loan and Exhibition Agreement
between
ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA
and
ART & HISTORY MUSEUMS- MAITLAND

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT, is made and entered into as of the date of last execution by and between Orange County, Florida, a charter county and political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County") and Art & History Museums-Maitland ("Lender").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, County and Lender entered into a loan and exhibition agreement on December 16, 2025 ("Agreement") for several works of art ("Artwork") depicted in Exhibit A to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 2 of the Agreement, the loan was to terminate on June 3, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the parties now desire to extend the loan and exhibition of the Artwork and amend the termination date of the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Amendment to the Agreement.** Section 2 of the Agreement is hereby amended as follows with additions being underlined and deletions ~~struck-through~~:
2. **Term.** The term of the Agreement shall commence on January 28, 2026 and terminate ~~June 3, 2026~~ on a date no later than September 29, 2026.
2. **Remainder of Agreement Unchanged.** All other terms, conditions and obligations of the County and Lender arising from the Agreement shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
3. **Effective Date.** This First Amendment shall become effective upon the last date of execution.
