Background on the Human Trafficking Pilot Program

- An ordinance was passed by the Board of County Commissioners on December 1, 2015
- February 2016 letters were sent to various businesses
- Posters were placed in establishments with contact information listed
- Missing from the process was a residential location for the victims to receive services



Background on Human Trafficking Pilot Program

- An RFP was issued and two agencies responded to it
- Aspire was awarded the contract in October 2017
- January 2018 the first victim was served in the program
- This program is the only program in Florida that provides these services



Human Trafficking in Orange County

- 11-13 years old is the average age entering into Human Trafficking
- Average life expectancy involved in trafficking is 7 years
- This year so far MBI recovered 16 adult victims
- 43 youth in Orange County have been rescued from trafficking in 2018
- Harbor House, Victim Service Center,
 United Abolitionist are several agencies
 that provide services





Program Structure

- The program serves female adult human trafficking victims
- Capacity is 10 beds
- Program focus is on Trauma Informed Care
- The duration of the services average 42 days
- Since January 2018, 81 adult unduplicated victims have been served



Service Components

- Strong partnership with other service providers
- •Involvement with AA and NA programs
- On going case management, mental health and substance abuse counseling
- Life skills, individual and group counseling, and off site activities
- Transition to long term safe housing



Program Effectiveness

- T was 2 years old when she first experienced abuse
- Her father quickly began sharing her with others
- Years of substance use and alcohol dependence helped T with the trauma
- •Her last attempted was the one that saved her



- Human Trafficking continues to be prevalent in our community
- The program is currently funded as a pilot program for this FY 19/20
- Aspire has served 81 unduplicated survivors as of September 25, 2019
- 86% of the victims served were transitioned into safe housing



- Continue to work closely with Aspire Health Partners to ensure services are provided as designed per the RFP
- Collaborate with other agencies
- Explore additional services that could be needed for victims
- Request for the BCC to fund this program permanently and not as a pilot program
