I would greatly appreciate your consideration of the following Open Discussion Items for the May 7, 2019 BCC meeting.

1. **Bus Benches** – A recent drive through my district revealed broken benches along Ivey Lane and in Tangelo Park community. Consequently, I would greatly appreciate an update from staff on our contract with Metro/Creative Outdoor and the company's project to replace bus benches throughout the county.
2. **Dual Rear Wheeled Vehicles in residential neighborhoods** – District 6 residents in Orlo Vista, Hiawassa Highlands and Pine Hills have experienced an uptick of tractor trailers parking in their neighborhoods after-hours and through the weekend. It appears the current fine of \$30 is not a deterrent. Please have staff present options to strengthen our regulations, empower Code Enforcement Officers and OCSO staff and streamline communications when residents report to 311, OCSO and Code Enforcement Division.

3. **Private Art Mural** – a recent wall mural, painted on TRS Inc. at 6330 Silver Star Road within the NID overlay on Powers Drive, created a spirited discussion between the residents, business owner and local artists. This issue brought to light the need for Orange County Government to enact an ordinance, similar to that of City of Orlando and Sanford. Also, it would be helpful to explore the role of NID and Safe Neighborhoods in this process in terms of overseeing and funding such projects as part of the revitalization initiatives in Pine Hills.
