98	(5) "Swim area" means an area where all vessels of any type are prohibited from entering.
100	(6) "Vessel" is synonymous with boat as referenced in s. 1(b), Art. VII of the State Constitution and
102	includes every description of watercraft, barge, and airboat, other than a seaplane on the water, used or capable of being
104	used as a means of transportation on water.
106	(7) "Waters of the state" means any navigable waters of the United States within the territorial limits of the
108	state of Florida, the marginal sea adjacent to the state of Florida and the high seas when navigated as a part of a
110	journey or ride to or from the shore of the state of Florida, and all the inland lakes, rivers, and canals under the
112	jurisdiction of the state of Florida.
114	(e) The provisions of this section may be enforced by issuance of a uniform boating citation by any law enforcement
116	officer as defined in Section 943.10, Florida Statutes, pursuant to the procedures set forth in Sections 327.73 and 327.74, Florida Statutes.

120	(f) Where a statute is referenced in this section, the reference shall be interpreted to mean the most recently adopted version of such statute.
