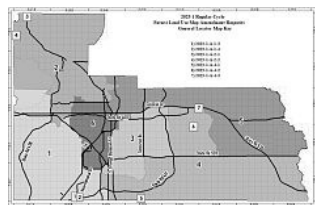

On Tuesday, February 21, 2023, beginning at 2:00 PM, or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, the Orange County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) shall conduct public hearings in the Orange County Administration Center at 201 S. Rosalind Ave., 1st Floor, in downtown Orlando, FL, regarding the transmission of the 2023-1 Regular Cycle Amendments to the Orange County Comprehensive Plan ("CP"), as it has been amended, as authorized by Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, for the following matters:
