

Results in 2024 and so far in 2025.

- -October 1, 2023 thru September 30, 2024
 - 192 companies served through events, business growth programs and educational outreach

 - 12 events held
- -October 1, 2024 thru March 31, 2025
 - 66 companies served through events, business growth programs and educational outreach
 - 10 GrowFL Florida Companies to Watch Honorees (20% of the total statewide honorees)

- Rally is a hub for early-stage social entrepreneurs working to solve pressing local and global challenges. We support local and international social entrepreneurs operating in Orange County, relocating to the area, or working to address issues impacting Orange County and its residents.
- Through individualized support, hands-on learning, and deep connections to a diverse network of mentors, business leaders, and changemakers, Rally helps passionate problem-solvers turn bold ideas into sustainable ventures that create measurable social and environmental impact.



Who they serve:

Rally serves early-stage social entrepreneurs who are operating in Orange County, relocating to the area, or building solutions that address challenges faced by Orange County residents. This includes a diverse mix of local leaders, minority business owners, and aspiring changemakers who are passionate about launching sustainable ventures that create meaningful social or environmental impact in their communities.



- Accelerator Cohorts Recruits and supports two cohorts each year.
 Accelerator is a four-month program with hands on coaching and mentorship helping at least 15 early-stage social entrepreneurs build ventures that address challenges in Orange County.
- Mentorship & Expert Connections Connect Rally Fellows with mentors and subject matter experts who provide guidance at key stages of their journey.
- Workshops for Local Entrepreneurs Hosts 6+ workshops introducing local entrepreneurs to social enterprise strategy and core venturebuilding tools.
- Full-Day Innovation Event Host a hands-on event where social entrepreneurs practice building, discovery and validating their ventures

Rally Funding

- The county provides \$107,000 annually, the total cost to deliver the Rally programing is \$287,360
- Other funding sources for Rally include: Rally Makers (which are individual and corporate donors) and the City Of Orlando



Since the start of 2024 to March 2025 we have:

- Served 29 entrepreneurs through our accelerator program
- Engaged 45 entrepreneurs through our Intro to Social Entrepreneurship workshops and by providing direct access to venture-building tools and resources
- Delivered 1 full-day Innovation Workshop with 35 attendees from Orange County and featured 15 social ventures; our next workshop closed applications on March 14 and is scheduled for April 11th
- Supported 8 Alumni Fellows in achieving significant sales growth and traction in their ventures
- Facilitated 43 mentor matches and engaged 34 subject matter experts to support entrepreneurs during and after the accelerator



2023 ORANGE COUNTY EXPORTS




- Compared to 2019, in 2023, Orange County exports grew by approximately 3 percent (3%)
- Together with the State, in 2022, Orange County experienced a recovery in exports that exceeded its prepandemic levels
- 2024 County data will not be available until September/ October '25
- Based on State-level 2024 results, OC export figures are expected to reflect neutral or modest growth vs. prior year



2025 TARIFF MODELING: IMPACTS TO ORANGE COUNTY




OC EXPORTS & IMPORTS BY RETALIATING COUNTRY

OC EXPORTS & IMPORTS BY RETALIATING COUNTRY




- In 2023, Orange County's top 5 import markets represent almost 47% of all merchandise import values.


