Resolution supporting the Purdue Pharma Bankruptcy Plan in settlement

of the opioid claims.

This item requests approval by the Board of a Resolution supporting the Purdue Pharma Bankruptcy Plan in resolution of the claims concerning the opioid crisis and authorization for the County Administrator to execute any formal agreements required by the Bankruptcy Court implementing the settlement.

In August 2019, Orange County filed suit in federal court against the manufacturers, distributors, and sellers of opioids and is part of the Federal Multidistrict National Prescription Opiate Litigation based in the Northern District of Ohio. In September 2019, Purdue Pharma filed for bankruptcy protection after being named a defendant in thousands of lawsuits, including the one filed by Orange County. Orange County filed its proof of claim and is now a participant in the proposed Purdue Bankruptcy Plan, which provides that the assets of Purdue, operating and sales revenues, certain insurance proceeds and contribution of \$4.275 billion over several years from the Sackler Family (the shareholders of Purdue) will be paid for use in abating the opioid crisis and distributed in accord with the Memorandum of Understanding (the "Florida Plan"). It is anticipated that approximately \$302,043,441 of the public entity funds will be apportioned to the State of Florida; but at this time, exactly how much Orange County will receive is unknown.

The County's outside counsel, Romano Law Group, et al., have indicated they believe the Plan represents a fair and equitable resolution of the opioid-related claims

against Purdue, was negotiated in good faith, and provides funds exclusively dedicated to programs designed to abate the opioid crisis within the community.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Approval and execution of Resolution of the Orange County Board of County Commissioners regarding Purdue Pharma Bankruptcy Plan authorizing Orange County (herein referred to as this "governmental unit") to join with the State of Florida and other local governmental units in supporting the Purdue Pharma Bankruptcy Plan and authorization for the County Administrator to execute the required documentation from the Bankruptcy Court in settlement of the bankruptcy claims.
