SUBJECT: Ratification of Purchase Order M103557, COVID-19 Testing and Site Personnel

ACTION REQUESTED:

Ratification of Purchase Order M103557, COVID-19 Testing and Site Personnel with CDR Maguire, Inc. dba CDR Health Care, Inc., in the not-to-exceed total amount of \$1,665,000.

PROCUREMENT:

This purchase order will provide funding for daily testing services at Barnett Park, seven days per week at a maximum of 1,700 test per day for the performance period of February 1, 2021 through February 28, 2021.

FUNDING:

Funding is available in account number 0001-060-2502-3197.

APPROVALS:

The Health Services Department concurs with this recommendation.

REMARKS:

This purchase order supports the County's response to the COVID-19 pandemic by providing testing and site personnel including specimen collection (clinical), registration, specimen collection assistant (non-clinical), viral test kits, laboratory services, site infrastructure, and management.

CDR Maguire, Inc. dba CDR Health Care, Inc. is currently conducting BinaxNOW rapid antigen testing, Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) testing, and data management at Barnett Park for Orange County residents. The ability to rapidly identify COVID-19 positive patients is necessary to minimizing the spread of COVID-19 in the community. A delay in running this test site would reduce the ability of County residents to obtain timely testing results.

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After negotiations with CDR Maguire, Inc. dba CDR Health Care, Inc. they reduced the prices per test effective February 1, 2021. This negotiation includes a reduced price per PCR test from \$85 to \$75, reduced site personnel fee per test from \$35 to \$25, and reduced the site infrastructure and management fee per test from \$27.50 to \$10. This new price structure will result in a significant savings to the County.
