In 2022, the Orange County Regional Settlement Fund Committee was appointed. The Committee was tasked with recommending funding priorities for the county. The Committee's recommendations are based in part on best practices identified by a group of experts brought together by Johns Hopkins University.

The Johns Hopkins team includes experts in public health, addiction medicine, recovery, treatment, and harm reduction. The team was created to develop guidelines to assist local communities in effectively spending money from opioid settlements.

Current County Funded Interventions

Orange County Board of Commissioners has appropriated general funds that have been instrumental to the following interventions that would be enhanced and expanded by the Opioids Settlement Trust Fund:

Treatment Interventions

- Orange County Jail Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) clinic
- Expand access to behavioral healthcare

Recovery Interventions

Recovery Enhancement Project (REP)

Prevention Interventions

- One Pill Can Kill Campaign
- ACT 2 Save a Life overdose recognition and response training



Five-year Trend for Opioid Related Deaths and Overdoses

Year	Estimated	Total # of	Estimated

2018	1,384,000	346	0.25
2019	1,395,000	365	0.26
2020	1,404,000	449	0.32
2021	1,423,000	539	0.38
2022	1,452,000	462	0.32



Regional Opioid Settlement Funds

- Total funds for years 1–6 \$26 million
- Average funding allocated for years 2-6 \$5.2 million
- Allocation of funds in five-year cycles allows for equal yearly distribution of funds—ensuring the sustainability of interventions that reduce overdoses and overdose deaths
- Conservative allocation of funds is recommended to account for discrepancies in funding projections due to bankruptcy proceedings for existing settlement agreements



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Treatment

Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) and other opioid-related treatments:

- Expand access to MAT and behavioral health services at Federally Qualified Health Centers
- Expand access to MAT and behavioral treatment options for individuals with substance use disorders who are uninsured, underinsured, or do not qualify for Medicaid/Medicare
- Explore offering mobile services to include MAT, telehealth, testing, and vaccinations



Treatment (cont.)

- Expand Naloxone distribution and Naloxone training
 - Opioid Navigator Street Teams
- Expand MAT education and awareness training for healthcare providers
 - Provide Physicians training and technical assistance
- Expand enrollment of infants diagnosed with Neonatal Abstinence
 Syndrome (NAS) in the Florida Early Steps Program
 - Hire a case manager to facilitate enrollment in the Early Steps
 Program



Recovery

- Expand the scope of Recovery Enhancement Project services
 - Expand the number of hospital-based and community-based Opioid Navigators
 - Create a seamless transition from inpatient to outpatient care & social support resources
 - Create a seamless transition from jail to outpatient care & social support resources
- Provide funding for an additional case manager in the 9th Circuit Court Jail Diversion Programs (Adult Drug, Opioid, Veterans, and Mental Health Courts)



Prevention

- Implement the CDC Stop Overdose campaign
 - Facts on Fentanyl
 - Polysubstance Use Facts
 - Life Saving Naloxone
 - Stigma reduction
- Promote the 24-Hour Recovery Support Hotline
 - Addiction Happens...Recovery Works
- Expand overdose recognition and response training
 - ACT 2 Save a Life
- Promote the Better Without It initiative
 - Targets Middle & High School students



Data Collection & Research

Utilize evidence-based data collection and research to analyze the effectiveness of treatment, recovery, and prevention interventions.

- Identify community-level protective factors
- Identify community-level barriers to healthcare
- Recommend policy or program changes to prevent overdoses
- Recommend new programs and services
