SUBJECT: Approval of Contract Y23-202, Supporting a Variety of Law Enforcement Related Initiatives That Will Enhance Essential County Services, Federal Subrecipient Agreement Between Orange County, Florida, and Orange County Sheriff's Office

### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Approval of Contract Y23-202, Supporting a Variety of Law Enforcement Related Initiatives That Will Enhance Essential County Services, Federal Subrecipient Agreement Between Orange County, Florida and Orange County Sheriff's Office, Florida, in the not-to-exceed amount of \$104,510.

### **PROCUREMENT:**

This subaward is issued from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program (United States Department of Justice) allocation received by the County on May 18, 2021.

This agreement will define the working relationship between Orange County, Florida and Orange County Sheriff's Office, the Federal Subrecipient. The performance period will be from date of execution through September 30, 2024.

### **FUNDING:**

Funding is available in account number 7303-060-7018-3197.

### **APPROVALS:**

The Office of Emergency Management concurs with this recommendation.

### **REMARKS:**

In accordance with the Code of Ordinances, Part I, Chapter 17, Article III, Section 17-286 – Application and exclusions, agreements between the Board and non-profit entities are excluded from competitive procurement requirements.

This agreement will provide the Orange County Sheriff's Office funding to acquire the following equipment necessary to prevent and control crime: 15 Avigilon H5A PTZ Cameras and Camera License for the Real Time Crime Center, known as Analytics,

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Intelligence, and Monitoring. The amount for this project is \$58,695.

Installation and purchase of two License Plate Reader (LPR) cameras. This purchase will continue build out of the LPR camera program to other high-crime Apopka areas including Tangerine and Zellwood and other areas of Sector 1, including Lockhart, Rosemont, and Eatonville. The amount for this project is \$44,000.

Purchase of one volcanic bicycle to the Emergency Response (ERT). This purchase will initiate the process of transitioning the ERT to a superior bicycle for crowd management missions. The amount for this project is \$1,815.
