Project Administration Subrecipient Agreements

On August 6, 2019, the Board approved Orange County's 2019-2020 Action Plan for housing and community development activities under federal Community Development Block Grant and Emergency Solutions Grant funded by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Action Plan utilizes some of the funding to support the delivery of social services and homeless activities. These activities are targeted to low-income persons and include, but are not limited to, home delivered meals for the elderly, subsidized childcare, job training and placement for disabled individuals, and emergency shelter for the homeless.
