Department of Health and Human Services - Health Resource and Services Administration (HRSA) Community Project Funding/Congressionally Directed

Spending – Non-Construction, Grant Award – 1GE1HS45839-01-00

In May 2022, the Mental Health and Homelessness Division, with the Grants Oversight Committee's approval, submitted an application for the Congressionally Directed Spending: Non-Construction Grant. This project is supported by Representative Stephanie Murphy. The grant will allow for expansion of the early childhood Breakthrough Project, an initiative of the Youth Mental Health Commission. The Breakthrough Project currently serves youth ages 9-17 with behavioral health concerns. This grant allows an expansion of evidence-based practices to focus on children from birth to age eight in Orange County and will allow training and certification of an additional 28 community clinicians in Parent-Child Interaction Therapy. Expansion of early childhood evidence-based practices is a recommendation in the Orange County Mental and Behavioral Health System of Care Community Analysis as well as the Youth Mental Health Commission. A contract to program these funds will be brought to the Board following acceptance of this grant award.

The Health Resources and Services Administration notified Orange County of a full grant award on June 8, 2022. This is a \$300,000 grant for a one-year project period beginning on July 1, 2022. This grant does not require a matching contribution.
