It counts to stay in your comfort zone

These 5 situations will benefit from you sticking to what you know best

ou'll likely have to step outside your comfort zone if you want to grow. Learning something new is often uncomfortable, but it's necessary for developing new skills and forging new neural pathways. While a growth mindset is a critical component for success, there are times when the better choice is to stay inside your comfort zone. Here are five times you should stick to what you're comfortable doing.

You're in a period of high stress

If you're experiencing a lot of stress or feel burned out, reconsider adding something new to your plate.

"Sticking to familiar routines can help you feel more in control," says Henna Pryor, author of "Good Awkward: How to Embrace the Embarrassing and Celebrate the Cringe to Become The Bravest You." "It's like finding a calm spot in the middle of a storm."

Katy Riddick, managing director for the strategic consulting firm High Lantern Group, agrees.

"If you are experiencing grief, trauma or other personal mental health challenges, sticking to what you know best can help maintain productivity and well-being without adding extra pressure," she says. It can also "have the positive benefit of still feeling like you are a valuable member of the team," Riddick added.

Sometimes, stress comes from the job itself, such as having a lot of out-of-your-comfort-zone activities

that coincide, says Joseph Galasso, a clinical psychologist and CEO of Baker Street Behavioral Health. "It is generally good strategy not to show up to every battle you are invited to. If you are already trying something new, or several something-news, that require you to be out of your comfort zone, it is OK to say no to others."

You're happy in your role

If you're in a job where you're a high performer, love your work and would be perfectly happy continuing in this role for years to come, it's perfectly fine to stay in your comfort zone, says Cheryl Naumann, chief human resources officer for the University of Phoenix.

"If you feel your role is not likely to be threatened by emerging technologies, and you're pretty confident that AI won't take over key parts of your work and render you obsolete, then sticking with your current role may be perfectly acceptable," she says.

Make sure you won't have regrets, though. "Most people find that stepping out of their comfort zone offers more satisfaction and greater rewards in the long run," Naumann says. "The nagging feelings of missed opportunities and chances that you passed up may take a greater toll as time passes than living in discomfort for the short term."

You need to be efficient or precise

Your comfort zone is home to the skills you've mastered, which enhances your efficiency and productivity, says Caitlin Collins, organizational psychologist and program strategy director at Betterworks, a goal-management software company.

"Expertise can lead to consistently high-quality work and can be especially valuable in roles that require precision and reliability," she explains. "At this level, the employee becomes a role model, even if not actively teaching others, and setting the example for how to do something very well for others to learn by example."

Your comfort zone can also help protect limited resources, Pryor says.

"When resources are tight — whether it's time, money or people — sticking to what you know works can help you get the most out of what you have. It's about being smart and not taking unnecessary risks," she says.

It's time to start searching for scholarships

If you have a high school child or grandchild, don't let them miss out on free money for college — not based on need — that is being handed out starting now.

Instead of heading back for senior year in high school hoping to coast for the next nine months, rising seniors should be spending their last few weeks of summer searching for college scholarships online. And this message also applies to those just going into their sophomore or junior years, since many scholarships are offered to high school students in those early years.

Kevin Ladd, chief operating officer and co-creator of Scholarships.com (Forbes' site to search for college funds), says this is a classic case of "the early bird gets the worm." Or in this case, the money. Some scholarships for fall 2025 will have deadlines in July or August — before the 2024 fall semester even starts. For those already in college, the search service also reveals free money to supplement student loans.

supplement student loans. And we are talking about a LOT of money. Aside from the free federal Pell Grants, which require low parental income on the FAFSA, there is a fortune waiting to be distributed to those who apply.

We are not talking about needs-based programs. Almost 75% of the millions of scholarships on Scholarships.com do not have any needs-based disclosure, although some may require completing the FAFSA, or Free Application for Federal Student Aid.

There is no cost for the online search, which matches students with possible scholarships. To offset the costs of running search engines, those who opt in at the beginning of their free search might see marketing campaigns for everything from dorm room furniture to credit cards.

Scholarships require work

The search is the simplest part of the scholarship hunt. Registering at Scholarships.com, or any other well-known sites such as Fastweb.com or using the search engine at College Board.com, is easy.

It's important to fill in all the search criteria. Scholarships.com filters include things beyond just your grade point average, including SAT and ACT


