SUBJ: Approval to Prohibit Specific Federal Highway Administration

Vehicle Classifications 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 from using Sunflower

Trail

Public Works has received numerous complaints regarding the use of Sunflower Trail as a haul road between E. Colonial Drive (S. R. 50) and Golden Isle Boulevard. Sunflower Trail is a platted residential street. The code states that no vehicular travel to or from an excavation or fill shall be allowed through a street, the primary purpose of which is to serve residential dwellings in a platted subdivision. The proper haul route is to use Avalon Park Boulevard between E. Colonial Drive (S. R. 50) and Golden Isle Boulevard instead of Sunflower Trail, and continue south on Avalon Park Boulevard to Alafaya Trail.

In accordance with section 316.555 Florida Statutes, and to improve safety, staff recommends that the Board approve to prohibit specific Federal Highway Administration Vehicle Classifications 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 from using Sunflower Trail and to install all appropriate signage.



## Sunflower Trail Consent Agenda District Map




