Charter Amendment 6

- During the November 5, 2024, general election, voters approved an increase in the number of County Commission districts in Orange County from six to eight, creating a nine-member County Commission, consisting of eight Commissioners and the County Mayor.
- Requires adoption of a revised redistricting map no later than November 1, 2025, to be effective for the 2026 general election.
- Estimated financial impact: One Time Costs \$2.6 million; Annual Recurring Costs \$1.3 million.



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Redistricting | Criteria

- Equal Population
 - The most important of the redistricting criteria
 - **–One Person = One Vote**
 - -Districts must be divided to ensure the population is as evenly distributed as practicable.
 - Ideal Population = Total Population / 8 Districts
 - Slight deviation between district populations is permitted in order to address other legal redistricting considerations
 - The maximum deviation (between most populated district and least populated district) should be no more than 10 percent (+/- 5%)



Racial and Language Minorities

- -Voting Rights Act, Section 2
 - Prohibits governments from denying or abridging any citizen's right to vote on account of race, color, or status as a member of a language minority group
- Section 2 prohibits minority vote dilution which, in single member districts, could impermissibly be accomplished by
 - Fracturing
 - Packing
- A violation of Section 2 has occurred if, as a result of the challenged map, the minority group in question does not have an equal opportunity to participate in the political process and to elect candidates of their choice

Redistricting | Criteria

• Geographic

-Contiguousness (required by Florida Constitution)

- –Compactness (most compact not required, but compactness must be a consideration "eyeball test")
- Permitted considerations (cannot be prioritized above equal population, race and language minority considerations, compactness, or contiguousness)
 - Preservation of political subdivisions
 - -Preservation of communities of interest
 - -Preservation of cores of prior districts
 - -General protection of incumbents





- Mid-decennial Redistricting Advisory Committee (MRAC)
 - -Created by a resolution
 - -Composed of 15 members
 - Three (3) individuals nominated by the Mayor, two (2) will serve as the Co-Chairs of the Committee
 - Two (2) individuals nominated by each of the six (6) Commissioners
 - -Review the 2020 Census data and updated population estimates
 - -Analyze proposed maps for commission district boundaries and recommend map(s) to the BCC by September 15, 2025

Redistricting | Process

- MRAC Staff Assistance
 - -Planning, Environmental & Developmental Services Department
 - -Community and Families Department
 - -Consultant hired for mapping and technology support
 - -County Attorney's Office
 - -County Comptroller
 - -Supervisor of Elections Office
- Ongoing Activities
 - -Internal coordination meetings
 - Discussions with consultant regarding population data and mapping software

Redistricting | Process

- Community Input
 - -Public MRAC meetings
 - -Broadcast meetings on Orange TV and social media
 - -Public-facing tool to analyze data and create maps
- Public Engagement
 - -Communications Division
 - -Social media



Redistricting Process

- MRAC Meetings
 - -Shall be noticed and open to the public
 - -Minutes of each meeting shall be recorded and open to inspection by the public
 - A quorum of eight (8) members must be present to conduct any meeting of the Committee
 - -One meeting will be held in each Commission District (6)
 - One public hearing to adopt map to recommend to the BCC (by September 15, 2025)
- BCC Meetings
 - -Work Session (anticipate late September/early October 2025)
 - Public Hearing to adopt the redistricting plan (must occur before November 1, 2025)
