Services in Orange County, Florida

On October 23, 2024, the Orange County Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council ("EMSAC") held a public hearing on Affordable Transport, Inc.'s ("ATI") application to renew ATI's Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("COPCN") to provide advanced life support ("ALS") and basic life support ("BLS") interfacility transport services in Orange County, Florida as required by Section 20-99 of the Orange County Code due to a substantial and material change in the status of ATI—on March 1, 2024, ATI entered into a Management Services Agreement and an Asset Purchase Agreement with MedFleet, LLC ("MedFleet") pursuant to which MedFleet agreed to provide certain management services for ATI like billing, personnel, asset management, licensing, and medical records management, and ATI agreed to sell certain assets and equipment to MedFleet like vehicles, contracts, and intellectual property rights, respectively.

At the public hearing, EMSAC reviewed ATI's renewal application. Orange County staff provided background information on said application and the agreements between ATI and MedFleet. EMSAC provided the applicant and the public with an opportunity to comment and be heard. MedFleet provided a history of its company and explained its agreement with ATI to provide management services. EMSAC confirmed that the agreements do not transfer or assign ATI's COPCN to MedFleet. EMSAC voted to recommend approval of ATI's COPCN renewal application.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve Affordable Transport, Inc.'s Application to Renew its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Provide Advanced Life Support and Basic Life Support Interfacility Transport Services in Orange County, Florida.
