ACTION REQUESTED:

Approval to award Agreement No. Y19-178, Antiterrorism and Emergency Assistance Program, to St. Petersburg College Center for Public Safety Innovation in the amount of \$244,532.

PROCUREMENT:

St. Petersburg College Center for Public Safety Innovation will coordinate training, assistance, and services to first responders impacted by the Pulse shooting as outlined in the Department of Justice, Antiterrorism and Emergency Assistance Program Grant. This will serve as a resource for all local jurisdiction first responders for assistance with training needs. First responders include police, fire, rescue, emergency medical services, hospital personnel, and the Medical Examiner's Office.

FUNDING:

Funding for this service is provided through Grant No. Z0003 from the State of Florida Department of Legal Affairs Office of the Attorney General. This grant was approved by the Board on August 1, 2017.
