Cooperative Extension Division Employment Agreement

Cooperative Extension in Orange County is administered through, and supported by, the University of Florida in collaboration with Orange County Government. Pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 1004.37(3), recommendations for Extension positions are to be presented for acceptance by the Board of County Commissioners.

Richard Tyson retired on July 27, 2019, and Edmund Thralls has capably served in the role of interim manager. During the last few months, the University has conducted a search for a new manager and the two-member Orange County interview panel selected Mr. Kevin F. Camm for the position of Manager of the Orange County Cooperative Extension Division.

Mr. Camm will be responsible for providing leadership, supervision and coordination of the total County Cooperative Extension Program including a faculty and staff of about 30, while building effective working relationships with employees, Extension Administration, County Government, community leaders, private sector clientele, media, related agencies, residents, and the general public.

During Mr. Camm's 12 years of broad-based experience in coordinating the 4-H Youth Development program and as an Extension Agent in the Agriculture and Natural Resources program, in both urban and rural communities, he has received numerous awards and has written for a variety of publications and bulletins. His resume is attached.

Mr. Camm's annual salary will be \$103,000 with a 40-60 split in funding sources between Orange County \$41,200 (40%) and the University of Florida \$61,800 (60%).

CURRENT RESPONSIBILITIES

I serve as Unit Coordinator and Extension Agent for both 4-H Youth Development and Agriculture & Natural Resources for Virginia Cooperative Extension in the City of Lynchburg. In this role, I focus on the development of new and innovative programs for both internal and external stakeholders. I recently served as a member of the District Program Leadership Team for three years providing district level training and assistance in the VCE programming process. My responsibilities also include developing strategic partnerships in the City of Lynchburg and strengthening external relations with local government and organizations.

PROFESSIONAL IMPACT

Throughout my twelve-year career in Extension, my basic mission has been to serve the local community by bringing innovative educational programs to the forefront in order to help the community as a whole. Since December of 2007, I have had the fortune of serving two localities in Virginia: Amelia and Lynchburg in different capacities — Amelia 4-H Extension Agent and City of Lynchburg 4-H and Agriculture and Natural Resources (ANR) Extension Agent.

When I transferred into Lynchburg in July 2010 as a dual role agent, I inherited a program that had 100 Extension Master Gardeners and virtually no 4-H presence. Through volunteer leadership and efforts of the 4^{th} and 5^{th} grade school programs (and other recruiting), the City of Lynchburg has a 4-H presence in all 11 elementary schools, three middle schools, and two high schools and the 4-H Camp numbers have grown to 70 campers.

The Extension Master Gardener (EMG) program in Lynchburg serves the City of Lynchburg and the counties of Amherst and Campbell and has an enrollment of over 150 active members who volunteer over 17,000 hours annually. Since arriving in 2010, they have volunteered over 141,000 hours to the area. Furthermore, as a response of Extension's Centennial celebration and the food disparity in Lynchburg, we created the Davis Instructional Garden (D.I.G. Site). This site is in year three of its operation and has several community garden plots, six demonstration gardens, three instructional raised beds, compost education center, and water harvesting technology all through a local partnership with HumanKind, formerly the Presbyterian Home.

I have served (and currently serve) in numerous leadership capacities within Extension and in the local community. Currently, I am President-elect of the Virginia Extension Service Association (VESA), on the planning committee of the 2020 National Association County Extension Agents (NACAA) Annual Meeting and Professional Improvement Conference (AM/PIC) in Virginia Beach and a past District Program Leadership Team (DPLT) member for the Central District. I am also a member of the Emerging Pests and Pesticide Management Program Team and have been Co-Chair of the Virginia Urban Agriculture Summit for the past four conferences throughout the Commonwealth. I am also on the Senior Extension Agent Review Panel. Locally, I have had the honor of serving on the Holiday Lake 4-H Center Board of Directors, and most recently served as the Past President of the Lynchburg Area Food Council and Board member of Lynchburg Grows.

Over the course of my career, I developed collaborative relationships with businesses, organizations and state agencies. I have also worked together with colleagues across the state in delivering trainings and presentations for Extension Master Gardener programs,

Strengthening Your Facilitation Skills, Innovative Leadership, Professional Development, and Winter Conferences. I also collaborate with different program areas to assist in the Reality Store programs, Science Fairs, Household Water Quality Testing, and Pesticide Recertification/Certification programs, among other events.
