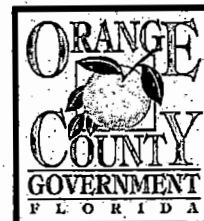

Comment: <p>Upon hosting a community convening in June where Chief Judge Myers and Clerk Moore Russell shared insight into what our community typically faces during the peak months, I was stunned to learn that there is an average of 1,000 evictions a month in a non-COVID year. A recent analysis by the global advisory firm, Stout Risius Ross, found that 1,110,000 renters in Florida are currently unable to pay rent. That is about 1 in 7 households in Florida. Heart of Florida United Way's 211 Information & Referral Crisis Line has received 4,188 calls, since mid-June, from callers indicating they expect to face eviction. In mid-March, 211's call volume was more than four-times higher than usual. Currently, we are still hovering around double the call volume. 211 is a vital community navigation resource to connect people with existing community resources, but when there is no available capacity for the resources to assist with the callers need, we hit a dead end. The need for support in our community far out paces the available resources – and consequences could be devastating for a family's future. When it comes to evictions, the obvious consequence could be homelessness, but there are so many other social consequences that can influence the trajectory of someone's life. Homelessness is just the tip of the iceberg. Kids will be pulled out of their schools. Families won't be able to find other affordable housing options due to incredibly low inventory in Central Florida. That means less proximity to shopping and transit, fewer job opportunities in affordable areas, access to healthcare, damaged credit – and everything else that comes with eviction. The list is long. The creation of an eviction diversion program is critical in lessening the consequences an eviction can reap on a family. Equally, an eviction diversion program helps landlords who have financial obligations of their own to meet. Dear Board of County Commissioners:

Residential tenants experiencing financial hardship in the wake of COVID-19 granted a reprieve will soon come to an end and neighborhood leaders are very concerned that the current economic environment will lead to record numbers of evictions. Previously, property owners, landlords and property management companies would place left items from foreclosures or rental properties by depositing mountains of household contents at curbside for Orange County services to clear at considerable expense. (See photos below) Even with Orange County weekly large item pick-up, the residue of post evictions aftermath has a history of being a sore eye to the community, and in some cases, a potential safety and/or health hazard.

We commend the BCC for taking swift action to designate \$20 million dollars in CARES Act monies for a COVID-19 Eviction Diversion Program. However, with the volume of 'flood of eviction filing expected', we are concerned that many of our streets within Pine Hills and across Orange County will once again be littered with household items on curbside.

The Pine Hills Community Council Board members discussed this situation at its recent Board meeting. Regardless of who is responsible for placing household contents at curbside, the property owner ultimately must be the one held responsible to shoulder the expense. We suggest:

1. An ordinance that requires a dumpster for such household cleanouts;
2. Landlords are required to withhold part or all of tenant's deposit for cleanout and disposal costs; and that
3. Orange County haulers are dispatched to remove the bulk items and debris with the cost charged to landlords adding to annual property tax assessment.

Any one or some combination of these approaches would go a long way toward preventing the unsightly and unsafe disposal practices now in place.

Dear Orange County Commission Members:

Right now, hundreds of Orlando airport concessions workers are furloughed due to the pandemic and do not know when they will go back to work. Many fear that a short-term crisis could become a long-term disaster for themselves and their families. We cannot control the timing of the economic recovery, but you can give workers hope that they will have jobs to go back to when things get better.

UNITE HERE Local 362, the union of hospitality workers in Central Florida, is calling on **the Greater Orlando Aviation Authority Board to require that HMSHost and other concessionaires recall their furloughed workers fairly, by seniority, as the concessionaires gradually reopen their restaurants, as a condition of any future relief granted to them.**

As the Orlando Airport is a great driver of the economy of Orange County, **we are asking you to raise this issue with Mayor Demings, who represents the County on the GOAA board, and urge him to pass a fair recall policy.**

The Orlando airport has given its largest concessionaire, HMSHost, **\$2.5 million** in relief and will be considering more at their next meeting on August 19, 2020. HMSHost is owned by Italian billionaires, while hundreds of Orlando HMSHost furloughed workers can't pay rent and bills, don't have enough food to eat, and lost health insurance coverage when HMSHost chose to discontinue it on June 4.

Passing a policy requiring a fair recall process is a common-sense thing to do. As businesses reopen or begin to restore operations to previous levels, they should commit to bring back the same employees they employed before the crisis hit. Employers would not have to bring back more employees than they need. They would simply have to bring back workers in order of length of service. Many responsible employers will likely do this anyways. But not all employers are so responsible.

We can't allow the COVID pandemic to be an opportunity for unscrupulous employers to get rid of workers, whether they are older, have families to support or have spoken up for public safety.
