- Retained Duncan Associates & PDG to update Fee Study



County Fire Service Area



- Unincorporated Area
- + Belle Isle and Edgewood (contracts)
- + Oakland (jointly-owned station)
- 19-acre island (Winter Park contract)



General Impact Fee Formula

Impact Fee = Calls x Net Capital Cost per Call

Net Capital Cost per Call = (Cost ÷ Calls) – Credit



Capital Cost per Fire Rescue Call

Cost		Station/Building Cost	\$51,009,951
		Vehicle/Equipment Cost	\$54,767,572
		Land Cost	\$9,866,909
Calls	→	Total Facility Cost	\$115,644,432
		÷ Total Annual Calls	86,005
		Capital Cost per Call	\$1,345

Notes: Station costs are insured values; vehicle costs are original costs from fixed asset listings; land costs are current land values from Orange County Property Appraiser



Net Capital Cost per Fire Rescue Call



Capital Cost per Call	\$1,345
– General Fund Credit per Call	-\$120
 Grant Funding Credit per Call 	-\$32
Net Capital Cost per Call	\$1,193

<u>Note</u>: General fund credit assumes half of future growthrelated improvements will be funded with general revenue





Comparative Fees - S-Family


Fire Fees per Single-Family Unit, Florida Counties, 2012





Comparative Fees - Retail


Fire Fees per 1,000 sf of Retail, Florida Counties, 2012





Comparative Fees - Office


Fire Fees per 1,000 sf of Office, Florida Counties, 2012

Requested Action (cont'd)

- CIE 1.4.1
 - Orange County shall continue to impose impact fees as a means of establishing and paying for future development's proportional cost of the capital improvements.
- CIE 1.6.1
 - Orange County shall assess impact fees on new development to cover a fair share of capital cost to provide those services to new growth.



Requested Action (cont'd)

- CIE 1.6.2
 - Impact Fees shall continue to be used to fund capital facility needs resulting from new development and shall not be used to fund existing deficiencies.
