On March 23, 2020 my 20 year old son's life was forever impacted by injuries he sustained at this intersection due to no fault of his own. He was transported by ambulance to Central Florida Regional Trauma Hospital where he spent 9 days to treat a pneumothorax and to repair his eye socket with three permanent metal plates and twelve screws. He continues to heal and is receiving additional treatment to address his vision not being fully restored. And while my energy and focus has been on my son, as a mother and a concerned citizen I must acknowledge the injuries sustained by the young women in the other car. I am aware of a spinal fusion for one passenger, and fractured vertebrae for another as well as various other soft tissue injuries.

The accident statistics Orange County prepared as they reviewed this intersection for remediation were not made privy to me. However, I can imagine they clearly present a case for immediate attention. I have lived at my address for 15 years and I can tell you there has been and continues to be an accident at that intersection at least once per month on average. When friends, neighbors, and family learned of my son's accident they kept me abreast of subsequent occurrences at this same intersection, all of which they believed to have sustained injuries based on the condition of the vehicles. Below are the accident dates since my son's on March 23:

March 27, 2020  
May 11, 2020  
June 3, 2020  
June 20, 2020

I implore you to approve the addition of a 4 Way Stop at this intersection. It would be negligent not to. It is also my hope that the board feels equally compelled to continue improvements to this intersection by working towards the installation of a permanent traffic signal.

For the benefit of the board, I've attached a few intersection photos from Google maps and some shared via social media from a recent accident. It shows a good view of the intersection.

About the agenda items before the board, County Administration II. A, 1. and item C. 1., I ask the board to approve both.

A general comment overall about the council's influence on housing and schools: Everyone is concerned about affordable housing. Item C recognizes the economic good that new multifamily development provides. Each project is \$50- 65MM of gross domestic product (GDP) surgically inserted into the county. This is good for many. The multifamily industry will provide affordable housing if allowed to do so. The greater the supply the greater the pressure on rents. Much like the transportation or computer industry, the more choices the consumer has the better for them and the lower the cost. The government must clear the path of obstacles that slow down the development of new supply. This includes the school aspect of the approval, and why I recommend approval. I understand traditionally developers have had to, as the argument goes, "pay their fair share", and they do. The process in Orange County and OCPS is very arduous, costly, and filled with uncertainty. Those three causes the risk of development to increase which in turn reduces the supply and increases the cost and rents. The more speed and certainty the more development will occur.

Though this agenda item is not about the future funding of the schools overall, there must be a sustainable solution for building new schools that does not hamper new multifamily development like the current system does. My suggestion is to ensure all property owners, to include apartment owners, pay their fair share of growth in their property taxes (millage rate) especially those that live in single-family residents, which are most likely to generate the most kids. And the school part of the millage should not be capped by homestead. Demand and growth are not capped, but taxes are hence there is a continual gap. Apartments do not generate kids; jobs bring families which have kids. Apartments are only a housing choice. The council should address the economic incentives that are provided to employers who are filling up our schools. Are they paying their fair share? Orange county and Orlando are very desirable places to live to begin with and I do not understand the need to pay employers to come here and then pass on the school burden to developers.

Thank you for your time and consideration of my comments. Please approve the items II, A. 1 and C. 1.

Adding 20 sworn sheriffs, five courthouse deputies, and two school resource officers to the tune of \$15 million will not increase the public safety of our community.
