Managerial Appointment - Health Services Department Director

As you are aware, we have recently experienced a vacancy for the position of Director of our Health Services Department, an important position of leadership toward ensuring the health and wellbeing of the citizens of Orange County. Over the past few weeks, our administrative team has worked aggressively to identify a top candidate for an appointment for this position.

At this time, it is my pleasure to appoint Dr. Raul Pino to serve as the next Director of the Health Services Department. Dr. Pino is a revered public health expert in Orange County and has an exceptional reputation amongst our citizens, as well as the professional medical community in Central Florida. Having served as the Chief Health Officer of the Department of Health – Orange County for the past three years, Dr. Pino has a rich history of working with our Health Services Department to meet the needs of our community. During these most recent years, Dr. Pino's leadership has been instrumental in the success of our public health initiatives, including our response to the COVID-19 pandemic. He has proven himself an asset to our public health efforts and will continue to provide valuable leadership to our community as our new Director of the Health Services Department.

As the Director of our Health Services Department, Dr. Pino will oversee all strategic, operational, and fiscal responsibilities of the department, which include the oversight of our Corrections Health Services, Drug-Free Office, Orange County Medical Clinic, Animal Services, and Mosquito Control Division, as well as our response to unique public health matters in Orange County.

Dr. Pino's educational background includes a Doctor of Medicine degree from the Instituto Superior de Ciencias Medicas de la Universidad de La Habana, Cuba, as well as a Master's degree in Public Health from the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. Prior to coming to the state of Florida in 2019, Dr. Pino served as the Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Health from 2015-2019.

Dr. Pino's appointment will be effective May 2, 2022, upon Board approval. His starting salary will be \$172,016.00, and his resume is attached for your review.
