Code Enforcement Board

- Has jurisdiction to hear and decide alleged violations of the codes and ordinances in force in the county
- Has the authority to levy fines against those persons found in non-compliance of county codes
- Subject to the inclusion of those professional specialties, each district of the county shall be represented by at least one member. Currently, Districts 1, 2, and 4 are not represented on the board
- Meets third Wednesday of each month at 9:00 a.m.
- Financial Disclosure Required



Code Enforcement Board

- Seven members appointed on the basis of experience or interest in the fields of zoning and building control
- Shall include, whenever possible:
 - An architect
 - A business person
 - An engineer/surveyor
 - A general contractor
 - A subcontractor
 - A licensed real estate broker or licensed real estate salesman
- Term of Rick Mellin has expired and there are three vacancies



• FIRST ACTION REQUESTED:

Reappointment of Rick J. Mellin, Jr. to the Code Enforcement Board with a term expiring December 31, 2019 or appointment of an individual to succeed him.



SECOND ACTION REQUESTED:

Appointment of three individuals to the Code Enforcement Board with terms expiring December 31, 2017, December 31, 2018, and December 31, 2019, respectively.
