- New Horizons an approved subdivision plan in South Apopka
- The 12-acre property is located on 13th Street and Washington Avenue
- Previous home to Hawthorne
 Village Apartments, an 84-unit farm worker housing complex
- Property title was transferred to Homes In Partnership (HIP) in 2003





- Engineering assessment determined it was cost prohibitive to renovate the complex
- In 2006 Homes in Partnership (HIP) vacated the tenants and demolished the buildings





Redevelopment Plan

- HIP conducted community meetings to align the redevelopment with the community's vision for the site
- Consensus to redevelop as single-family affordable development
- Consistent with future land use for this site



Redevelopment Plan

- The PSP for the proposed development was originally approved by the BCC in September 2008
- Great recession, housing market collapse, and financial constraints placed the project on hold
- New partnership created in 2016 breathed new life into the project





Redevelopment Plan

- New Partnership Composition:
 - -Homes In Partnership
 - -Habitat for Humanity of Greater Orlando
 - Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County and Greater Apopka
 - –Orange County











- HIP will act as the developer of the New Horizons project
- Orange County will contribute \$724,000 of INVEST funds for construction activities related to site work
- HIP will complete site development work creating 56 buildable lots

Development Partners

- Two Habitats will purchase the lots from Homes in Partnership (HIP) for \$14,000 per lot
- The lot cost is intended to reimburse HIP for its expenses in getting the property ready for development:
 - -Demolition cost
 - —Engineering/surveying cost
 - —Property taxes
 - -Miscellaneous costs



Development Partners

- Both Habitats have been awarded Community
 Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to cover the cost of purchasing the lots
- Agreements with both Habitats will be submitted to the Board for approval in March of 2017







Development Partners

- Habitat for Humanity of Greater Orlando will construct 34 homes
- Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County and Greater Apopka will construct 22 homes
- Home details:
 - -Size 1,079-1,510sf
 - -Number of bedrooms 3-5, 1 bath
 - -Fair market value- \$140K-\$154K
