ACTION REQUESTED:

Approval to award Invitation for Bids Y17-1037-MV, Liquid Caustic Soda 50%, to the low responsive and responsible bidder, Brenntag Mid-South, Inc., for an estimated contract award amount of \$655,520 for a 1-year term. Further request authorization for the Procurement Division to renew the contract for four additional 1-year terms.

## PROCUREMENT:

Liquid Caustic Soda 50% is used to adjust the pH level of finished drinking water in order to meet the requirements of the Safe Drinking Water Act and applicable State of Florida regulations. Orders will be placed on an as-needed basis.
