ISO Public Protection Classification

- ISO's PPC program accurately measures the effectiveness of public fire protection for structures in 46,200 fire districts across the country
- PPC considers the overall fire suppression service capability relative to the risk in the graded area
- Better fire protection – as measured by the PPC – generally leads to a better loss experience for insured structural damage



Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS)

- A community fire suppression evaluation, not just a fire department evaluation
- The FSRS is a first alarm schedule
- 105.5 points possible
- Acknowledged and accepted measurement of a community's fire suppression capabilities
- References proven national standards

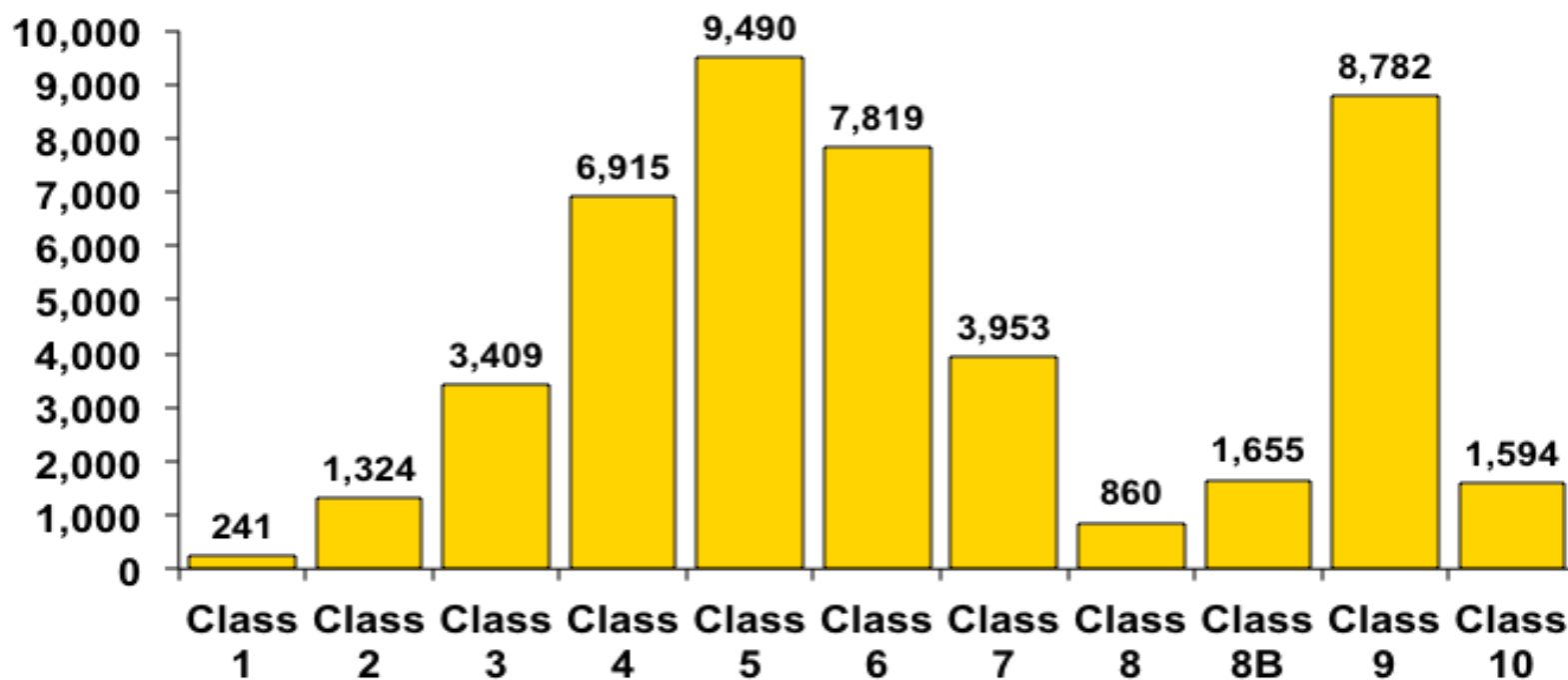

PPC Distribution

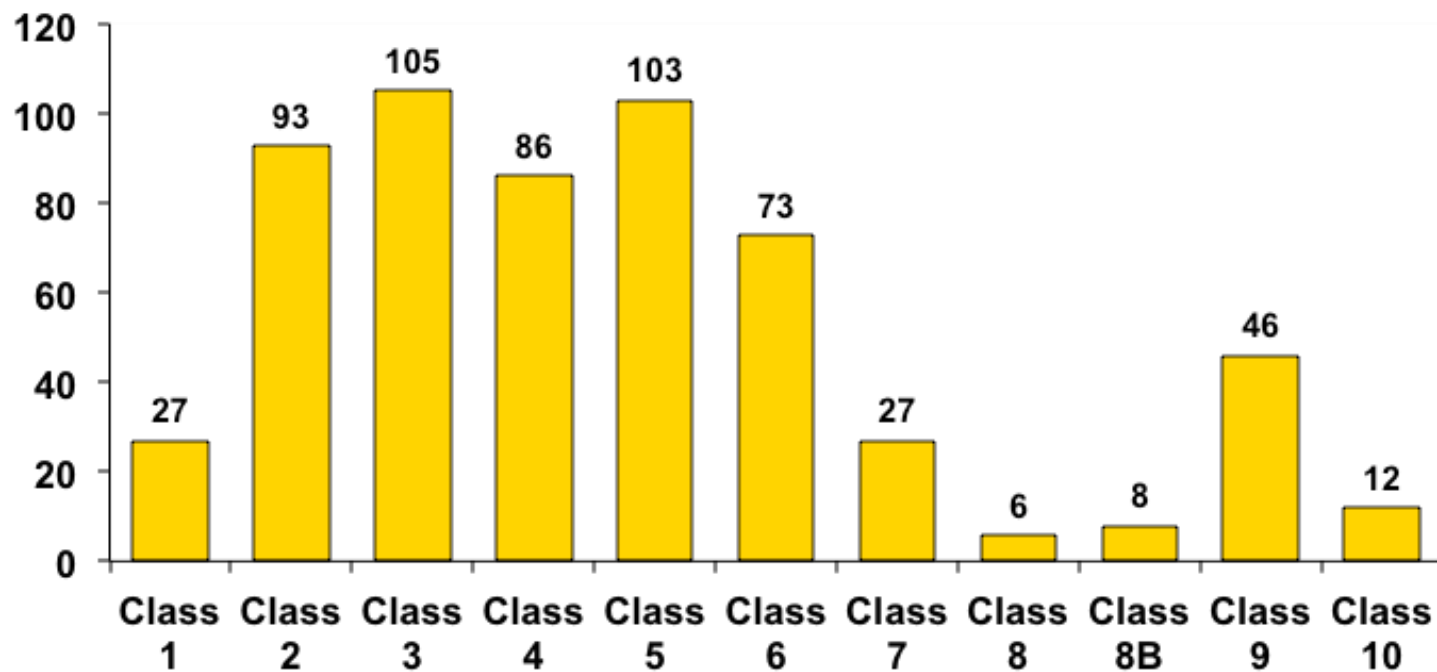

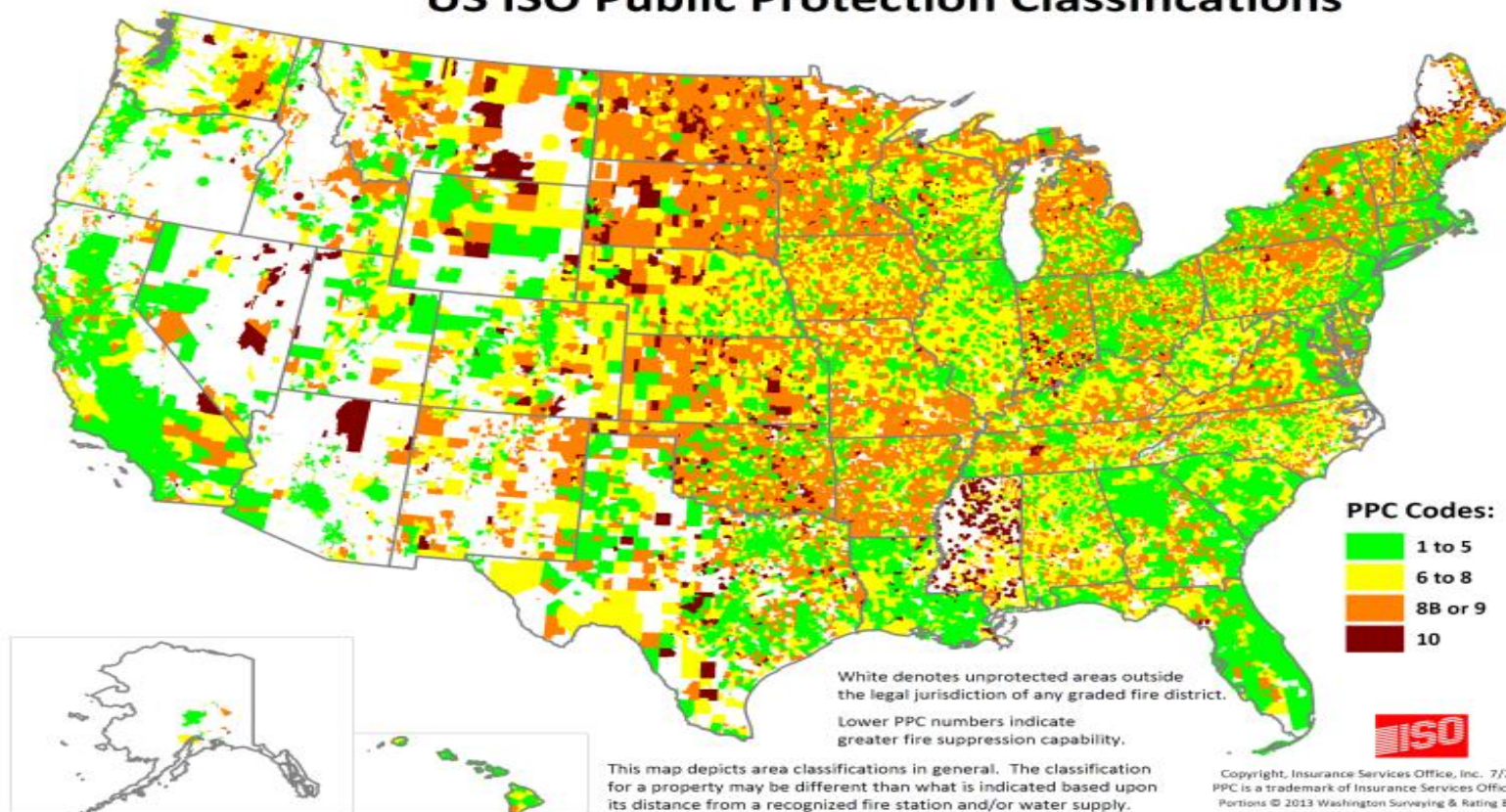

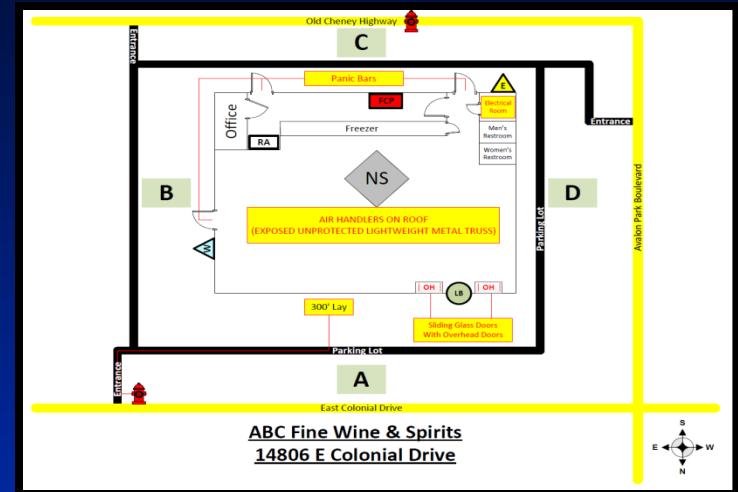
- **Planning & Technical Services Conducted a Self-Assessment Report**

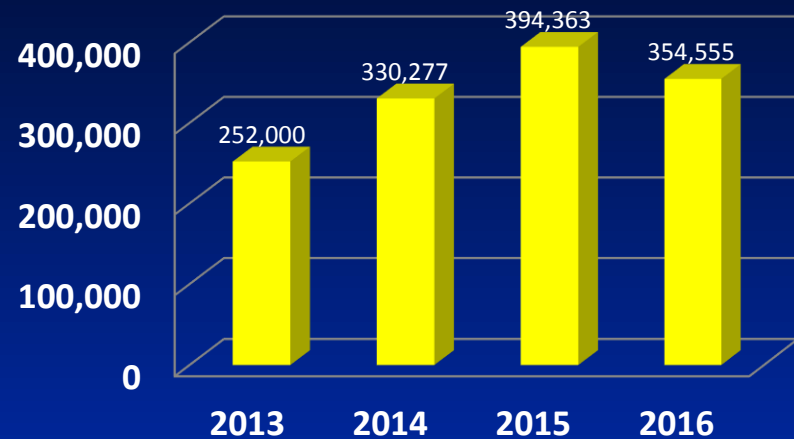

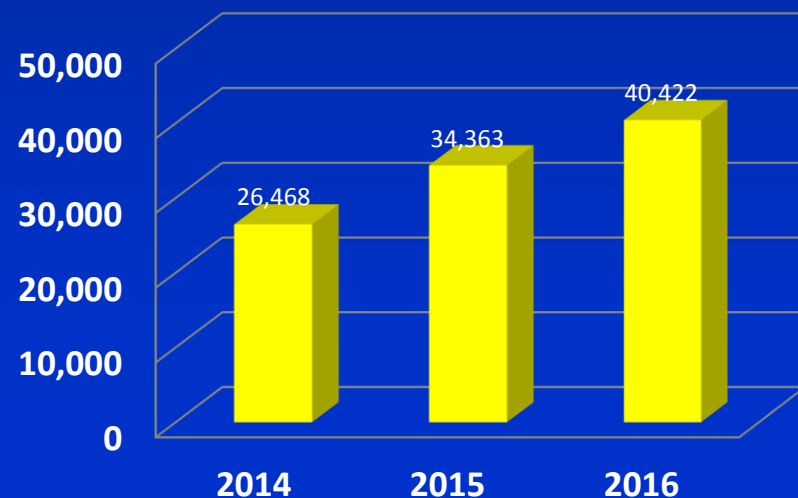

- Fire prevention Education for K through 12 Grade Students





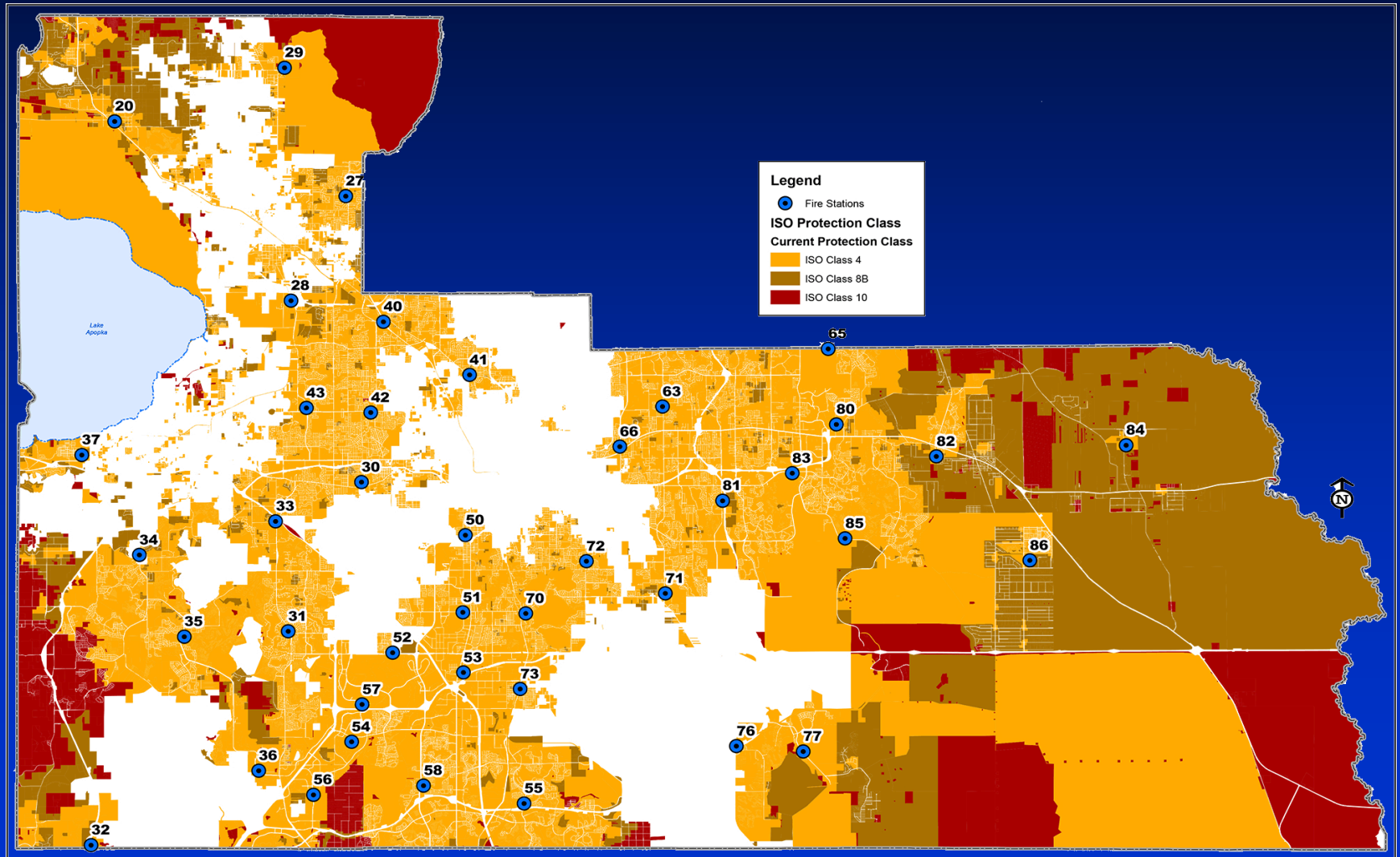
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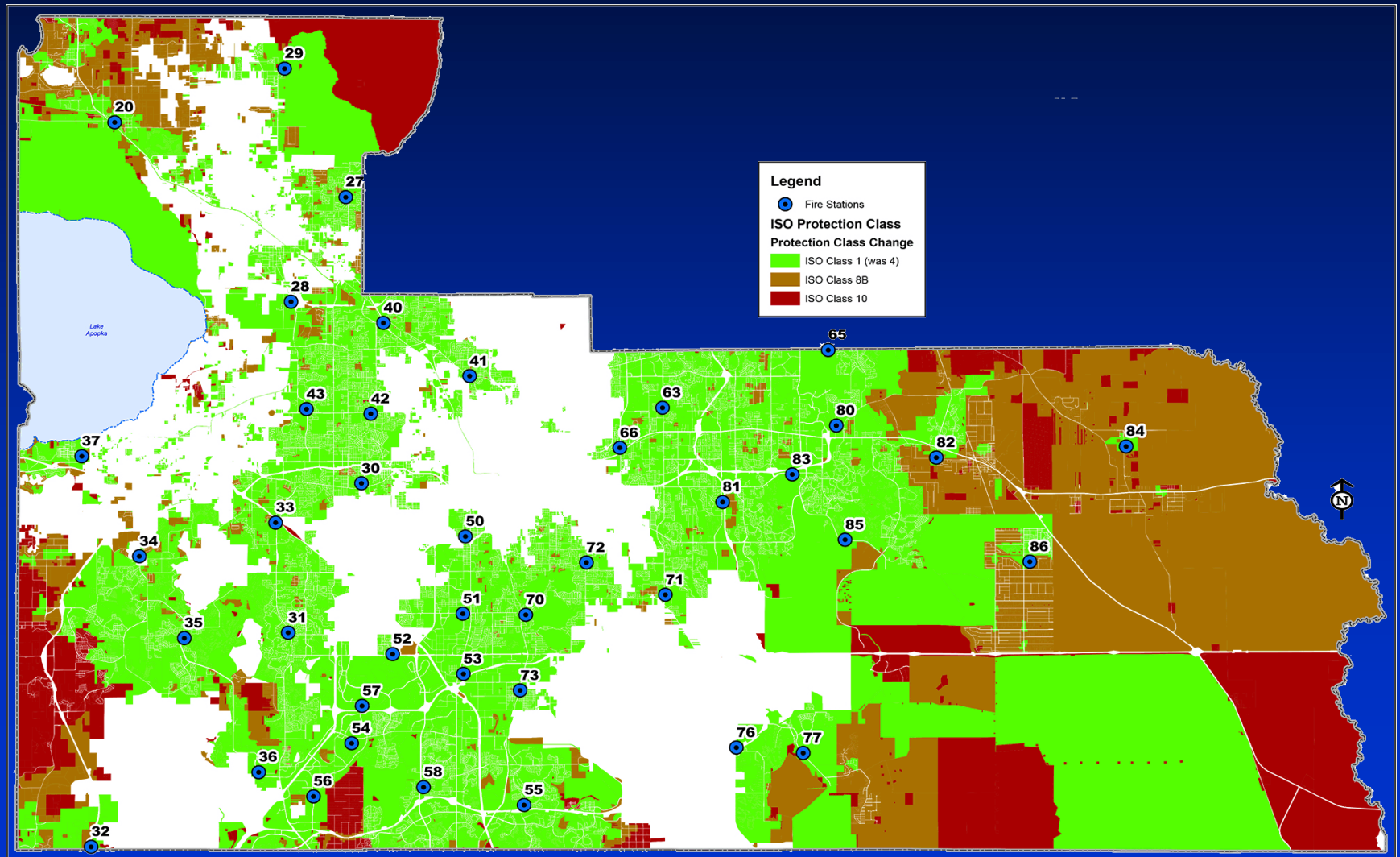


Previous ISO PPC



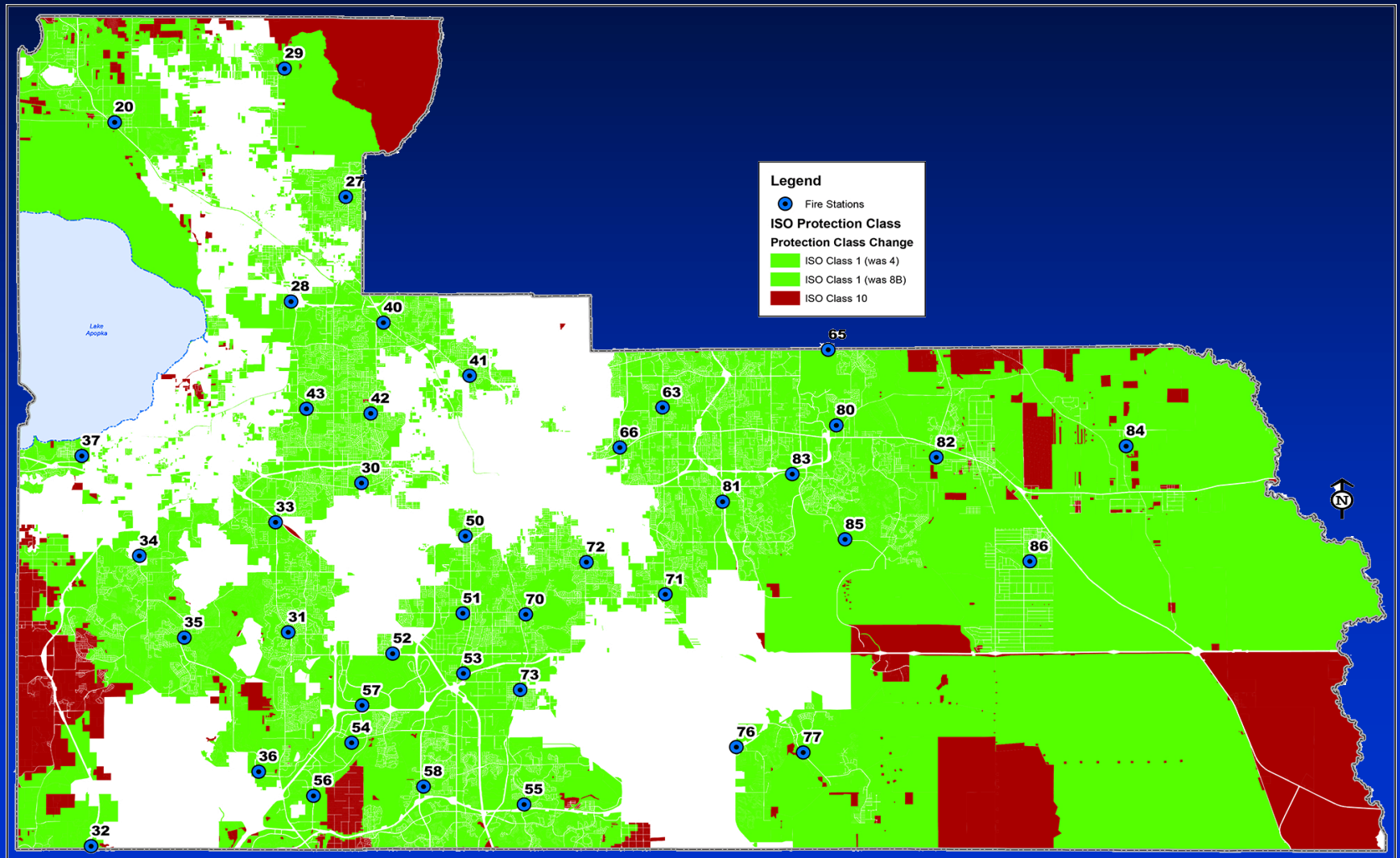


ISO PPC Class 4 to Class 1



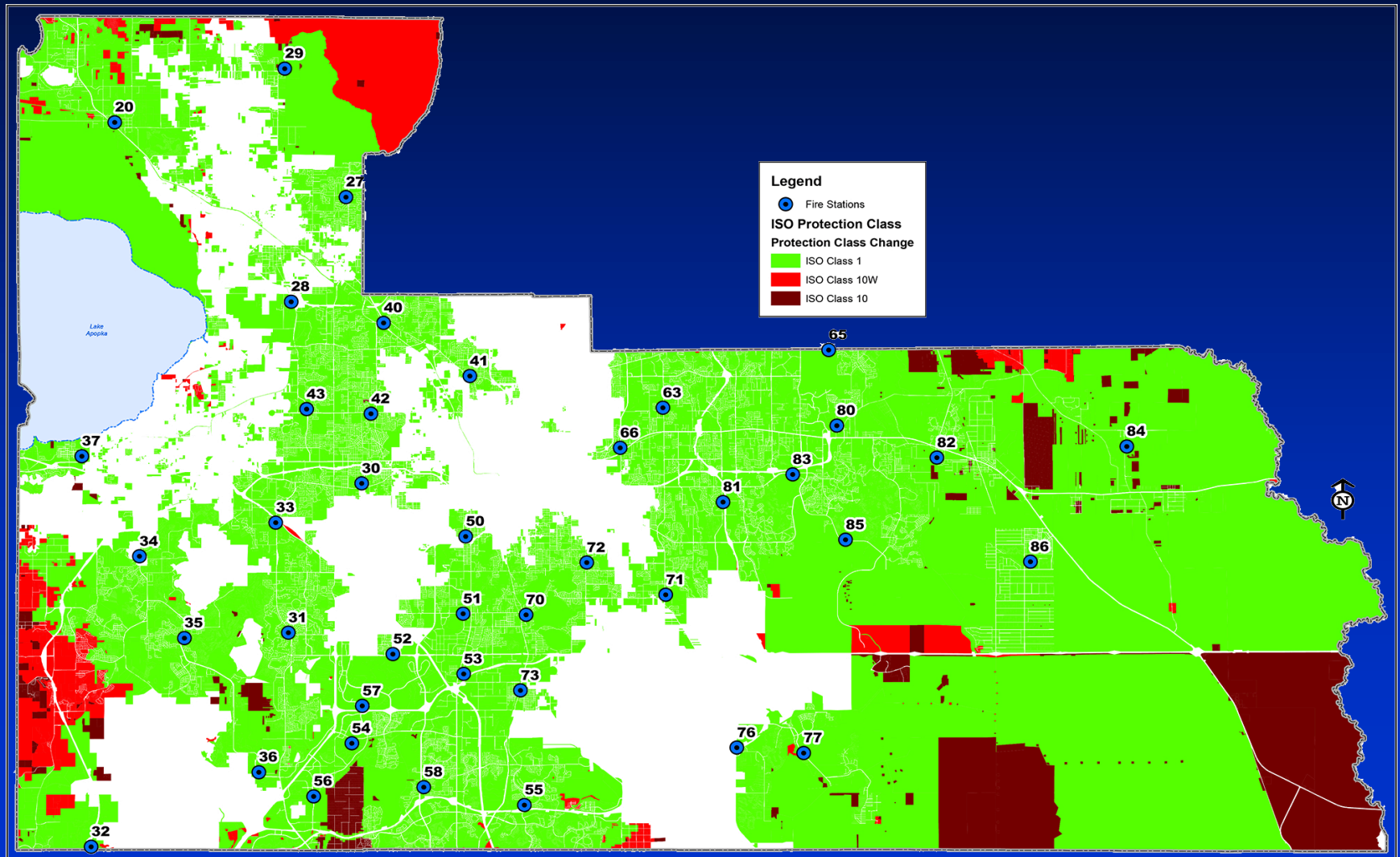


ISO PPC Class 8B to Class 1

- **Increase Community Risk Reduction Services**



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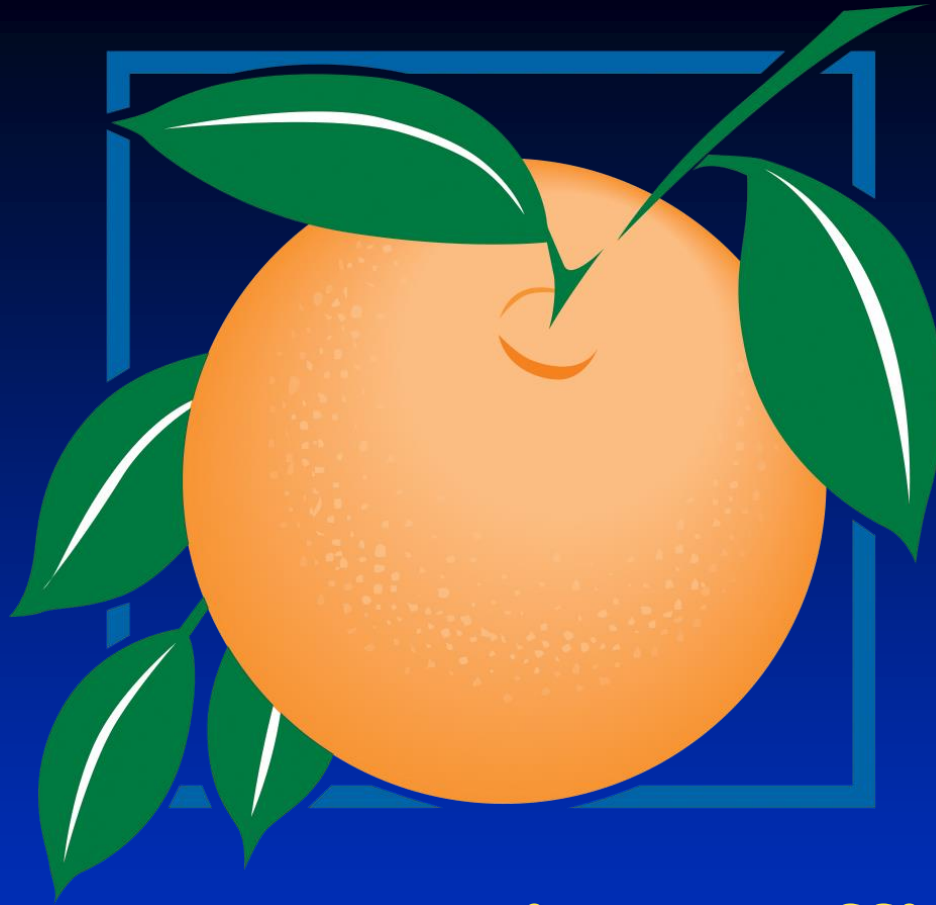
