Subject: FY 2017 Cultural Facilities Funding Recommendations Discussion Agenda Item – May 23, 2017

The approved FY 2017 Arts and Cultural Affairs budget funds two main programs: Cultural Tourism (CT) and Cultural Facilities (CF). Both programs provide money from the Tourist Development Tax (TDT) collections for eligible arts organizations to promote tourism and to construct, extend, enlarge, remodel, repair, improve or equip a 501(c)(3) museum, or publicly owned museum or auditorium.

On May 23, 2017, I will be presenting the FY 2017 CF grant award recommendations for approval along with two CT-type projects. In addition, I will present the annual State of the Arts report, an informational presentation on Public Art projects, and the proposed FY 2018 budget allocations for the Arts and Cultural Affairs program as recommended by the Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Council.

Background — CF Funding Recommendations:

The Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Council spent years creating and fine-tuning the application and procedures for funding support of cultural facilities. In finding a process that complies with state law for the use of TDT revenues and meets the Council's goals of elevating Central Florida's art and culture to a status befitting a world-class community, the Council examined numerous criteria to make funding recommendations.

Six members of the Advisory Council and four industry experts served on the CF Review Panel to evaluate and score the five eligible applications submitted for funding this year. After site visits, a thorough review by every review panel member and intense discussion regarding the impact to be made by these projects, the funding recommendations listed are presented unanimously by the Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Council. Their recommendation supports funding four proposals based on eligible score rankings.

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Recommended Grant Awards:

The Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Council recommends the following four CF projects for funding from accounting line number 4430-035-0990-8610 for a total of \$867,351.

- 1) Orlando Science Center for STEM Discovery Center. The proposed FY2017 funding for this project is \$500,000; the total budget for this project is \$1,050,000.
- 2) Garden Theatre for "Gear Up for Year 10: From Sound to Stage." The proposed FY2017 funding for this project is \$140,103; the total budget for this project is \$294,216.
- 3) Orlando Repertory Theatre for "Bridging Spaces: The Florida Blue Lobby." The proposed FY2017 funding for this project is \$197,248; the total budget for this project is \$414,222.
- 4) Pine Castle Historical Society, \$30,000 for Pine Castle History Center. The proposed FY2017 funding for this project is \$30,000; the total budget for this project is \$77,193.

The Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Council also recommends the following two CT projects for funding also from accounting line number 4430-035-0990-8610 for a total of \$300,000.

- 1) Cornell Fine Arts Museum for "Towards Impressionism." The proposed FY2017 funding for this project is \$150,000; the total budget for this project is \$480,000.
- 2) PAST, \$150,000 for "Black Lives Out Loud" at The Wells' Built Museum. The proposed FY2017 funding for this project is \$150,000; the total budget for this project is \$735,095. Approval comes with the following conditions:
 - a. Require PAST to affirm in writing that the goal of preserving, organizing, digitizing and maintaining all of its resources can be met using the \$150,000 County grant, and PAST's other financial and in-kind contributions as set forth in its application.
 - b. Require that the contract contain: (a) a maximum retainer not to exceed 15% of the contract price; (b) objective measureable standards and deliverables as a condition to payment; (c) a fixed contract amount not subject to modification or increase based on hourly (or other) charges; (d) contain a 5% contingency
 - c. Require that PAST use the County funds only for the purpose of preservation, organization, digitizing and maintenance of the cultural resource and require that any funding for the interactive display be the subject of another grant application or other resource.

ACTION REQUESTED: Approval of proposed Cultural Facilities grants and Cultural Tourism grants as recommended by the Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Council in the amount of \$1,167,351.
