- Governed by Florida Statutes
- Open to nonprofit museum or government-owned auditorium venue

# Process

- Requires Site Visit after application
- Scoring according to matrix:
  - Concept (Need, Vision, Inspiring Excellence)
  - Facility (Process/Design/Planning, Quality)
  - Management & Budget (Readiness, Stewardship)
- Minimum scoring threshold to be eligible

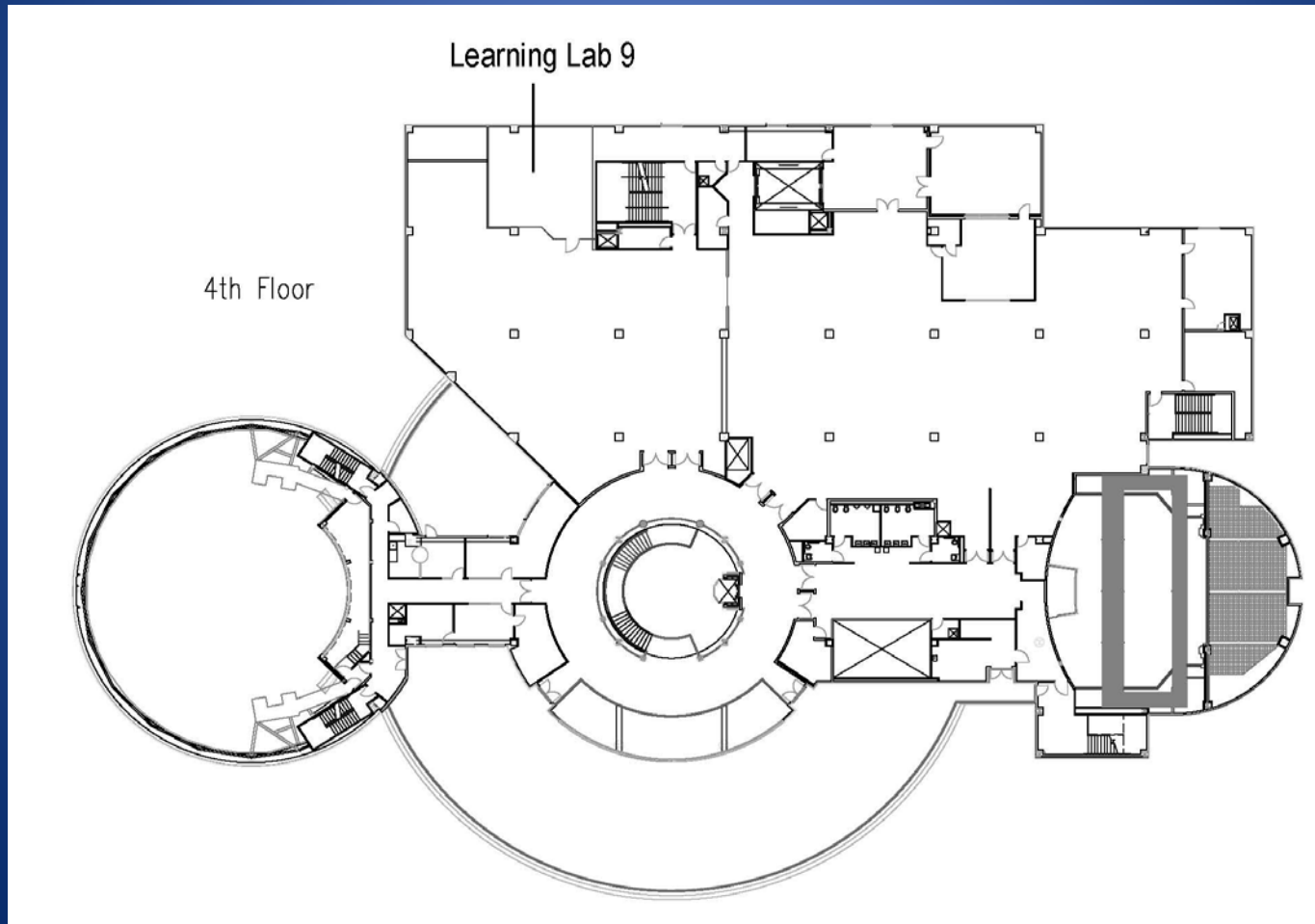

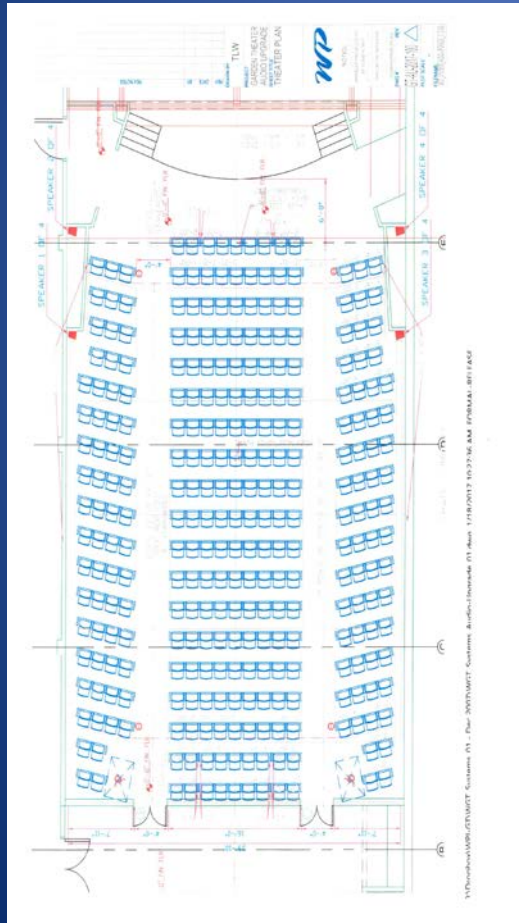

- 1- RESIL PAD @ 16" O.C. ON SLEEPERS
- 2- SLEEPERS RUN NORTH/SOUTH @ 16" O.C. WITH MDO PLYWOOD SET IN CAULK BEAD, PLANE SLEEPER TO 1 1/4" THICKNESS
- 3- MDO PLYWOOD TO HAVE JOINTS CAULKED, LAYOUT SO THAT THERE ARE NO "4 CORNER" JOINTS, ALL JOINTS TO HAVE 2 CORNERS I.E.

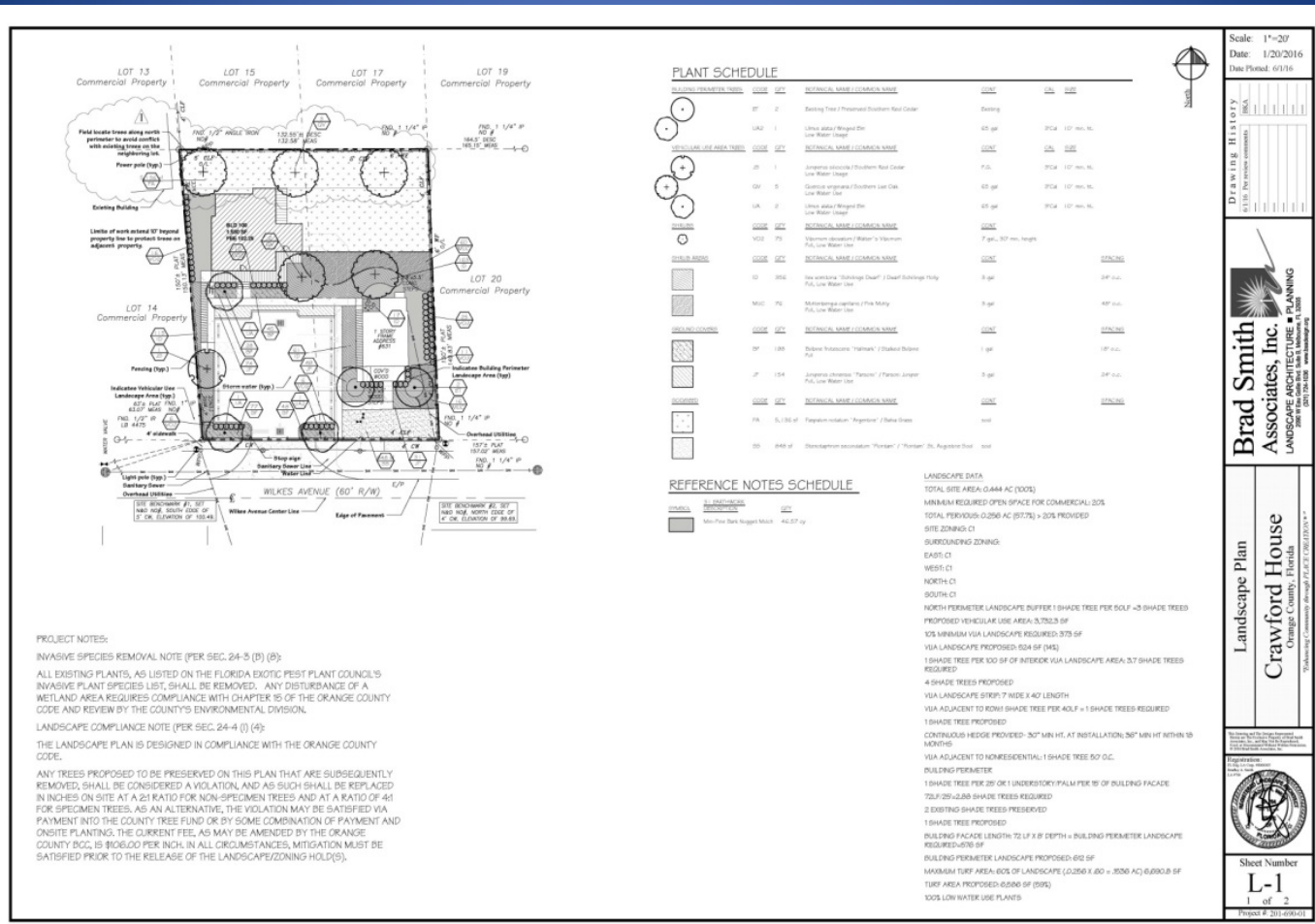

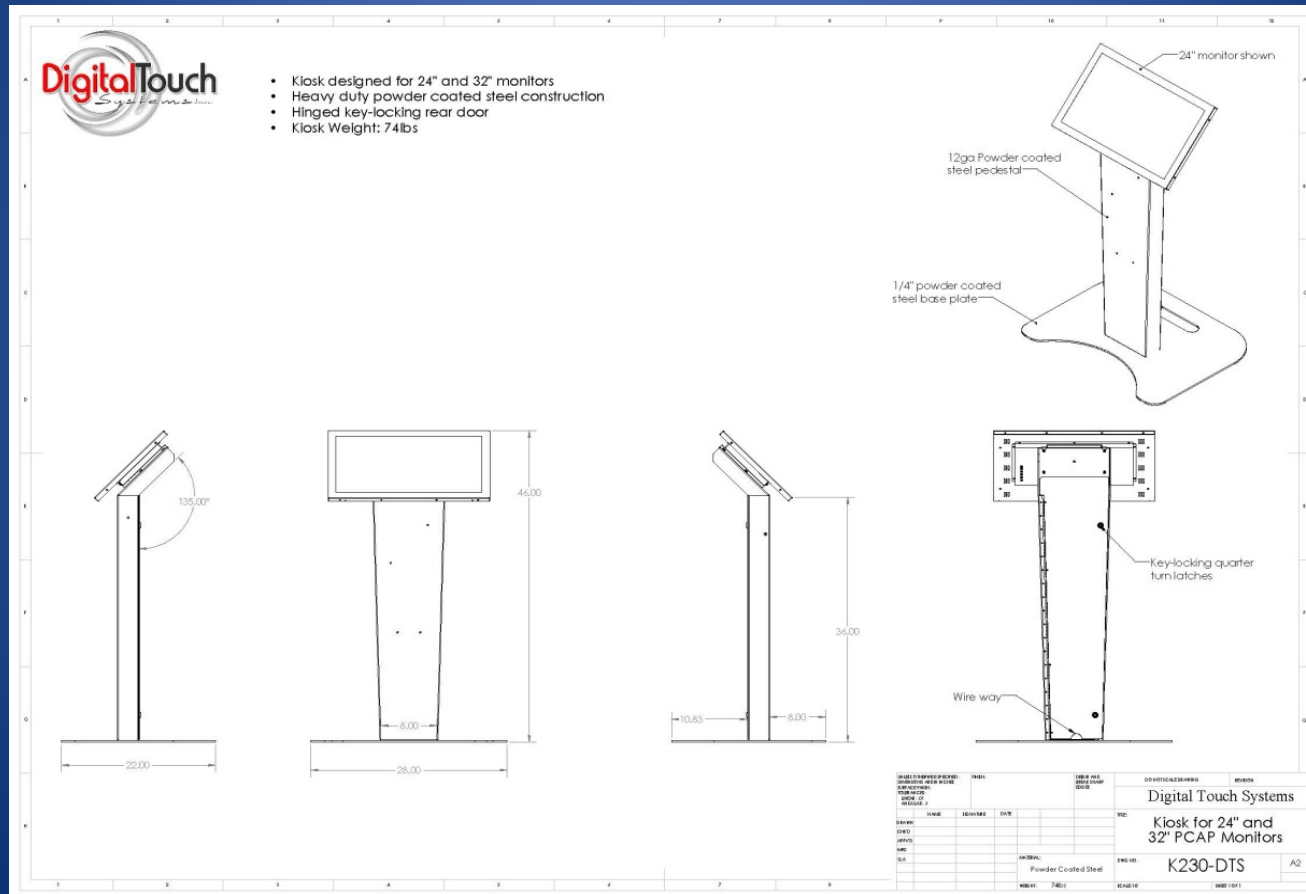
