


Background

UpdateRequested Action



- There are two transfer stations that deliver waste to the Orange County Landfill
- Transfer stations allow for garbage truckloads of waste to be loaded into an 18-wheeler
- Transfer stations reduce traffic and emissions while providing more efficiency for collection routes








Porter Transfer Station began operations in 1972 and was updated in 1989





 McLeod Road Transfer Station was a City of Orlando incinerator built in 1972 and Orange County converted it to a transfer station in 1986







Due to the age of the facilities and to better handle growth, both facilities are scheduled for upgrades





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 September 24, 2013 -BCC approved a \$1.6 million contract based on an estimated \$8 million rehabilitation of the McLeod Road Transfer Station







- Initial review of McLeod Road Transfer Station revealed:
 - Electrical system doesn't meet current code
 - Floor foundation requires full replacement
 - Leachate system wells and pumps need to be replaced
 - Underground piping needs replacement





- Initial review concluded it is more cost effective to rebuild the facility than to upgrade
- The rebuild will modernize the facility to provide more efficiencies and benefits to citizens and businesses
- Operations to be temporarily suspended during construction (10-12 months) and waste will be directed to Porter Transfer Station and landfill



Contract was modified to incorporate the rebuilding

 Amendment 1 was issued December 8, 2015, for \$1,289,743 for preliminary design and permitting of the rebuild





- During preliminary design and permitting, several items were identified to improve efficiencies and safety
 - -Additional land
 - -Stormwater system design and improvements
 - -Sewer system replacement
 - -New scalehouse with outbound scales
- Contract amendment needed to address changes identified in preliminary design



Amendment 2 for \$2,785,318.80 includes final design, permitting, conducting substantial and final inspections, and certification of construction documents for FDEP and the City of Orlando





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Approval of Amendment No. 2, Contract Y13-808, Professional Engineering and Design Services for replacement of L.B. McLeod Road Solid Waste Transfer Station with Neel-Schaffer, Inc. in the amount of \$2,785,318.80 for a revised contract amount of \$4,379,609.28
