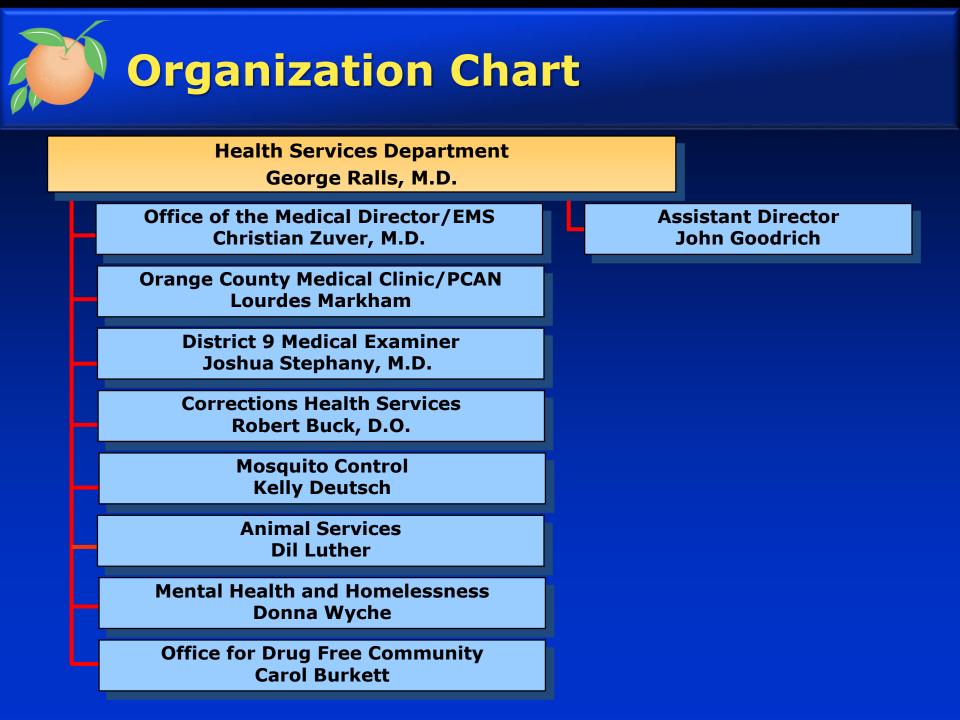

- Office of the Medical Director
 - CPR training for all Orange County Sheriff's Deputies
 - Response and support for several large scale events
 - Standing orders and training for countywide Naloxone program
- Orange County Medical Clinic/PCAN
 - Received \$2M in donated specialty care services
 - Over \$1M in free medication through the Patient Assistance Program





- District 9 Medical Examiner's Office
 - Implemented state of the art digital x-ray system
 - Participated in planning efforts to improve family assistance during large scale events
- Ryan White Part A
 - Integrated HOPWA housing program into service delivery system
 - Transitioned to a new case management software system





- Office For Drug Free Community
 - Orange County Heroin Task Force
 - Addiction Treatment Program at OCCD
 - Community Outreach and Education
 - Prescription Drug Takeback days
- Mental Health and Homelessness
 - Housed over 100 families in Rapid Rehousing Program
 - Youth "Mobile Crisis" program implemented
 - Key role in family assistance services for victims of Pulse tragedy





Mosquito Control

- Response to Zika Virus, Chikungunya and Dengue threats
- Over 47,000 properties surveyed in last 12 months
- Introducing Gambusia (mosquito fish) as an additional measure against Aedes

• Animal Services

- 109,700 visitors to Animal Services last year
- Over 8,300 adoptions (new record year)
- Low-cost Spay/Neuter clinics
- Over 23,000 hours donated by volunteers

Budget Challenges

Mosquito Control

- Zika Virus
 - Aedes species control is difficult
 - Abatement efforts require door-todoor visits
 - Seasonal staffing needs are being met by use of several part-time officers
 - Local transmission of Zika will result in a significant increase in workload and control activities





OCMC/PCAN

Federal Healthcare Law Changes

- May affect PCAN needs
- May affect Medicaid Contribution

Drug Free Office

- Identifying most effective way to address the drug abuse crisis
 - Vivitrol program at OCCD will be carefully evaluated
 - Strategic adjustments may be required
