




Projections

Blockbuster Fund

- Initiated in 2015
- Criteria
 - 100,000 attendance
 - Two to three years planning
 - Collaborative arts partners
- First approved applications this year
 - Visions of the Hispanic Word
 - IMMERSE 2020
 - Hurricane Irma Relief Fund

- Must have had TDT investment previously.
- 16 out of 31 eligible organizations have significant losses.
- Damages and backstop to event losses covered.
- Application vetted by Legal Department and Comptroller's Office.

Requested Action

Approval of the Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Council's funding recommendations for FY 2018 cultural tourism in the amount of \$2,679,650 and Blockbuster funding for Visions of the Hispanic World (\$200,000), IMMERSE 2020 (\$200,000) and up to \$300,00 for Hurricane Irma repairs and event losses for TDT-funded arts organizations.

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
