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Land Development Regulations Cultivating, Processing, Definitions

Definitions

Zoning Districts:

- Cultivation: A-1 and A-2
- Processing: I2/I3 and I4

Requirements:


- Maintain valid state license and appropriate authorization
- Obtain building/use permit
- 500 foot distance separation from schools
- Comply with state-approved security measures
- Allow appropriate inspections to determine compliance

 All other regulation for cultivation and processing preempted to the state

Eligible Zoning (Cultivation) A-1 & A-2


500' Buffer of School Parcels

Eligible Zoning (Processing) I2/I3 and I4

500' Buffer of School Parcels (Analysis does not Include PDs with Industrial Usage)





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Land Development Regulations Allow Dispensing

Zoning Districts:

– C-1, C-2, and C-3


Requirements:

- Maintain a valid state license and authority to dispense
- Obtain building/use permit
- 500 foot distance separation from schools
- Comply with state-approved security measures
- Allow appropriate inspections to determine compliance
- Prohibition on sale of non-medical marijuana, alcohol, drug paraphernalia, illicit drug-related products, and on the dispensing of medical marijuana in the waiting area of a dispensing facility
- Meeting the appropriate parking requirements
- Adequate seating for patients and invitees so as to discourage loitering
- Only dispense between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 pm
- State-approved signage that meets the County's Code requirements as well as any applicable Planned Development requirements

Land Development Regulations Allow Dispensing

Eligible Zoning C-1, C-2 & C-3

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Land Development Regulations Ban Dispensing

 Repeal existing moratorium and replace with a ban on dispensing facilities within unincorporated Orange County



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Ordinance Changes Allow

ALLOW

- Valid License
 - Delete Lines 135 139, 209 213, and 287 291

Inspections by the appropriate County or law enforcement officials may be made as necessary to determine compliance with state law. At least seventy-two (72) hours before a cultivating/processing/dispensing facility terminates operation, the owner must notify the Orange County Sheriff's Office.

• Add at lines 140, 214, and 292:

Any cultivation/processing/dispensing facility not licensed by the State is hereby prohibited within unincorporated Orange County.

- <u>Security</u>
 - Lines 175 181, 249 -255, and 429 435 delete as follows:

...government permits. The security plan approved by the Florida Department of Health for the cultivation/processing/dispensing facility must be filed with the Orange County Sheriff's Office before the cultivation/processing/dispensing facility opens and any changes to the security plan must be filed with the Orange County Sheriff's Office within seven (7) days of approval by the Florida Department of Health.



Ordinance Changes Allow

- ALLOW (continued)
 - Inspections
 - Lines 187 197, 261 -271, and 441 451 modify as follows:

With the permission of the applicable property owner or tenant or with a warrant obtained in accordance with Chapter 933, Florida Statutes, a <u>Any law enforcement</u> officer <u>deputy sheriff</u> employed by the Orange County Sheriff's Office <u>may make</u> searches of persons, places, and conveyances of any kind whatsoever associated with the <u>cultivation/processing/dispensing</u> facility in accordance with all applicable laws., a <u>Any</u> code enforcement officer, or any other person authorized to enforce county ordinances may enter the <u>cultivation/processing/dispensing</u> facility premises and conduct an inspection to determine compliance with this article <u>section</u> at any time the <u>cultivation/processing/dispensing</u> facility is open or occupied. Refusal to allow entry to the premises provide proof of a valid license and <u>cultivation/processing/dispensing</u> <u>authority from the state</u> shall be considered a violation of this code.



Ordinance Changes Ban

BAN

- Valid License
 - Delete Lines 195 199 and 267 273:

Inspections by the appropriate County or law enforcement officials may be made as necessary to determine compliance with state law. At least seventy-two (72) hours before a cultivating/processing facility terminates operation, the owner must notify the Orange County Sheriff's Office.

• Add at lines 200 and 274:

Any cultivation/processing facility not licensed by the State is hereby prohibited within unincorporated Orange County.

- <u>Security</u>

• Lines 235 -241 and 309– 315 delete as follows:

...government permits. The security plan approved by the Florida Department of Health for the cultivation/processing facility must be filed with the Orange County Sheriff's Office before the cultivation/processing facility opens and any changes to the security plan must be filed with the Orange County Sheriff's Office within seven (7) days of approval by the Florida Department of Health.



Ordinance Changes Ban

- BAN (continued)
 - Inspections
 - Lines 247 257 and 321 331, modify as follows:

With the permission of the applicable property owner or tenant or with a warrant obtained in accordance with Chapter 933, Florida Statutes, a <u>Any law enforcement</u> officer deputy sheriff employed by the Orange County Sheriff's Office <u>may make</u> searches of persons, places, and conveyances of any kind whatsoever associated with the cultivation/processing facility in accordance with all applicable laws., a <u>Any</u> code enforcement officer, or any other person authorized to enforce county ordinances may enter the cultivation/processing premises and conduct an inspection to determine compliance with this article section at any time the cultivation/processing facility is open or occupied. Refusal to allow entry to the premises provide proof of a valid license and cultivation/processing authority from the state shall be considered a violation of this code.

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PZC / LPA Recommendations

PZC / LPA public hearing on October 19, 2017

- Allow:
 - Make a finding of *inconsistency* with the Comprehensive Plan and *recommend denial*
- Ban:
 - Make a finding of *consistency* with the Comprehensive Plan and *recommend approval*
- Request that legislature provide greater home rule authority
- If BCC adopts a ban on dispensaries, recommend that the ban be reconsidered after next legislative session
