## **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Approval to award Invitation for Bids Y18-601-PD, Sand Skink Mitigation Credits, to the low responsive and responsible bidder, Southern States Land & Timber, LLC in the total contract award amount of \$416,150.

# PROCUREMENT:

To purchase sand skink mitigation credits required before constructing the Malcolm Road Water Supply Facility.

# **FUNDING:**

Funding is available in account number 4420 038 1557 6310.

## APPROVALS:

The Utilities Engineering and Business Development Divisions concur with this recommendation.

## **REMARKS**:

Three bids were received in response to this Invitation for Bids and were evaluated for price, responsiveness, and responsibility. Southern States Land & Timber, LLC is the low responsive and responsible bidder.

Orange County Utilities is preparing to begin construction on the Malcolm Road Water Supply Facility in western Orange County. The site is prime habitat for an endangered species of sand skinks. Orange County followed US Fish and Wildlife Services guidelines and performed a cover board survey to identify the presence of sand skinks. Based on the location of sand skinks at the site and

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future use of the land, the Utilities Department must purchase 20.3 sand skink credits. The mitigation credits must be purchased before construction begins. Mitigation Credits provide restored and protected land to offset adverse impacts to species and their habitat protected under the Endangered Species Act.

Bid tabulation is as follows:
