SUBJECT:	Contract Y18-2000, Homeless Shelter Prevention/Diversion Services

ACTION REQUESTED:

Approval of Contract Y18-2000, Homeless Shelter Prevention/Diversion Services, with Coalition for the Homeless of Central Florida, Inc., in the estimated contract award amount of \$400,000 for a 1-year term. Further request authorization to renew the contract for two additional 1-year terms.

PROCUREMENT:

To provide shelter prevention and diversion services to serve the current homeless population and residents who may become homeless. The intent is to create a front-end system to attempt to prevent homelessness and the need for shelter by prioritizing the most vulnerable and assisting individuals and families with the most appropriate resources; thus, creating a system that reduces shelter stays and promotes housing stability.

Funding for this project is available in account 0001-060-2504-3197.

APPROVALS:

The Mental Health and Homeless Issues Division concurs with this recommendation.

<u>REMARKS:</u>

The Coalition for the Homeless of Central Florida, Inc., a not-for-profit corporation, is the largest provider of homeless sheltering services in Central Florida. Additionally, they are currently the only shelter within Orange County providing services though the Housing

and Urban Development Continuum of Care Coordinated Entry System of which Orange County is a participant. This community wide system is designed to prioritize families and individuals for limited housing resources and shelter beds using a vulnerability assessment. Prioritization ensures that the most vulnerable are provided with scarce resources first.

Orange County currently contracts with the Coalition for the Homeless of Central Florida, Inc. for on-site bridge housing for the rapid rehousing program, resulting in a satisfactory record of service. The budget established for this project is based on similar contracts within the Continuum of Care system. This contract will be a cost reimbursement and invoiced monthly.
